NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners,

There is a story that circulates in clerical circles about a newly ordained priest, who, one Saturday night, received an assignment from his bishop to deliver the Sunday homily at the Bishop's cathedral church the next morning. He was very concerned about this commission because he was so new to the priesthood. He told his bishop, "I have never preached to such a large congregation and I have nothing prepared!" The bishop handed him his Bible and answered, "Trust the Lord. Just trust the Lord." Later that night, the young priest leafed through the bishop's Bible and came upon some typewritten notes that the bishop had tucked into the Bible. He liked them very much and decided to take them to the pulpit the next morning. He delivered an eloquent and uplifting sermon that pleased the congregation immensely. Later, as the people filed past him and complimented his work, the young priest was approached by the bishop himself, who told him that he had just preached the sermon that he, the bishop, was going to deliver that night! "What should I do now?" asked the bishop. "Trust the Lord, Bishop," said the priest. "Just trust the Lord!"

Trust is such an important facet of our relationship with Jesus, a relationship that Jesus cherishes. Saint Faustina (1905-1938) was once going through a trial so painful that she wondered if she could go on living. She prayed to St. Therese of Lisieux (1874-1897) for help. A short time later, St. Therese appeared to Faustina in a dream and comforted her. Faustina asked Therese if she, too, would become a saint. Therese answered, "Yes". Faustina pressed further, "Shall I be a saint as you are, raised to the Altar?" Therese replied, "Yes, you will be a saint just as I am, but you must trust in the Lord Jesus."

On one hand, trusting in Jesus is easy because He has earned our trust a thousand fold. He created us, He suffered and died for us, and He has given so much to each of us on a regular basis. He cares so much for us! In this very political time in which each candidate explains what he or she is "for" we are certain that Jesus

is for us. If that is the case, *who can be against us?* (Rom 8:31). How many times has He answered our prayers? How many times has He come to our rescue when, like Faustina, we were not sure that we could go on? From this point of view, humble confidence in Jesus seems so natural, so normal.

On the other hand, we know from experience that trusting in Jesus is sometimes a challenge because He operates in our lives in a mysterious way, according to His own wisdom that far exceeds our created intellectual ability to understand. He sometimes allows some real bitterness to befall us, like a surgeon who makes a painful incision. Moreover, we cannot see the future, and all the wonderful things Jesus has in store for us. The Apostle once said: *Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it even dawned upon us what God has ready for those who love Him.* (1 Cor. 2:9). It's ironic that in our life journey of existential footsteps we can see behind us, through memory, but we cannot see even five minutes ahead of us into the future. It is ironic, because the opposite occurs in each physical journey that we take with actual footsteps: we can see ahead of us with our eyeballs but we cannot see behind us at all!

Trust the Lord. Jesus once told St. Faustina in 1934, "Oh, how much I am hurt by a soul's distrust! Such a soul professes that I am Holy and Just, but does not believe that I am Mercy and does not trust in My Goodness. Even the devils glorify My Justice but do not believe in MY Goodness." [Diary of St. Faustina] In spite of all the many trials and tribulations that we suffer, even though we stand in the midst of a world that seems to be traveling in a negative direction, notwithstanding the many times that we are gripped by fear and uncertainty, the advice of the young priest seems very helpful: just trust the Lord. If our hearts do not seem able to the task, let us pray for the grace of humble confidence in Jesus. When (and not "if") He answers that prayer our trust in Him will blossom.
