NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners,

Recently we held a Parish Finance Council meeting. We analyzed the financial statement for the fiscal year 2014-2015, which ended August 31, 2015. I have included a copy of that statement as a bulletin insert so that you can see the figures for yourselves. The parish shows a loss in that time frame in the amount of \$46,348. In other words, our expenses exceeded our revenue by that very amount. There are several on-time occurrences that contributed to this result. In 2015, the Archdiocese of New York implemented an early retirement offer to employees who met certain criteria. In addition to an increase in pension benefits, the package included a severance payment based on length of service for those who accepted the offer. We had several employees who opted to retire and so the "Salaries and Benefits" entry on the financial statement includes the cost of the severance and other increased pension costs.

Another factor in the deficit is that the church and school had some major repair expenses during the last fiscal year. Both the church and school buildings needed roof repairs, and the interior of the church sustained damage as a result of vandalism. Moreover, the cost of snow removal last year was very high. While our school is now under the management of the Catholic School Region of Staten Island, the parish is still the owner of the school property and as such, is responsible for major repairs to the building. In addition, the school building is used for many parish programs that bear a proportionate cost of utilities. Furthermore, each year we pay a tax of \$38,000 for the support of the regional schools.

Sacred Heart depends heavily on the support of our parishioners through the regular weekly collection and the Easter and Christmas collections. In the last five years, the regular collections have declined by approximately 3% while the sum of the Easter and Christmas collections shows an increase of nearly 6%. When combined, the total support from our parishioners in 2015 was the same as in 2011. However, many expenses continue to increase.

As our older, long term parishioners leave us, it is critical that our younger and newer members support the parish on a regular basis and fill the financial gap to maintain our vibrant parish. The parish has some significant debt to the Archdiocese. There are loans totaling \$376,800 that are interest bearing. Our buildings are old and these loans were incurred to cover the costs of much needed repairs to the church roof, the school roofs, and upgrades in the school to meet new fire code regulations. We are confident that we will be able to meet the quarterly payments of approximately \$18,000. In addition, we owe the Archdiocese just over \$340,000 for unpaid medical, pension and insurance bills that date prior to 2007. Finally, the Archdiocese provided support to our wonderful school over several years and the grants amounted to \$1,360,600. While constituting further parish debt, these school grants will need to be repaid only if Sacred Heart receives an extraordinary windfall.

Some practical measures to help our parish that were recommended by the Finance Council include an estate planning talk, which would encourage parishioners to list Sacred Heart Church in their wills. An increased giving campaign was also mentioned so that the weekly collection could see immediate gains. The council also urged that we examine the possibility of *Parish Pay*, a system of electronic giving, which usually has a positive impact on a parish revenue stream. I have tried to keep expenses down since my arrival in August. The rectory no longer has a full time cook. I have refrained from hiring a parochial vicar. Moreover, we have eliminated several minor unnecessary expenditures such as newspaper subscriptions.

Ash Wednesday Schedule

Ashes will be distributed after the homily at the parish Masses: 7:00am, 9:00am, 12:00 noon and 7:00pm. Ashes will also be distributed in conjunction with a brief Service of the Word at 3:00pm.

Lenten Regulations

1 - Lent is to be observed as a special season of prayer, penance and Christian charity.

2 - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat. They are also days of fasting, allowing one full meal.

3 - The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The obligation of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday obliges all Catholics 21 years of age until the completion of their 59th year. The obligation of abstinence obliges all Catholics from the age of 14. Those whose health or efficiency of work would be substantially impaired by fast and abstinence are excused from physical mortification. When there is doubt or question regarding an individual's obligation a priest should be consulted.

4 - The Fridays of the year outside of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat. Other practices of voluntary penance may be substituted for abstinence from meat. These practices may be acts of self-denial, temperance, daily Mass, personal prayer, charity or Christian witness.
