A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Recently the Gospel reading for Mass spoke of how *Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.* (Luke 2:52). Following the Mass I was speaking to a parishioner, who is very dedicated to studying the Holy Bible. He asked me about that verse and it spawned a good discussion. We spoke of how Catholics are not to infer that Jesus somehow increased in His knowledge and wisdom over time. St. Cyril of Alexandria wrote that He is said to increase or advance, “not as if that nature that was perfect from the beginning received increase, but that by degrees it was manifested.” (*Liber Thesaurus*). In other words, from the public point of view, according to the common opinion of His age, Jesus seemed to be increasing in wisdom. As the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity with a human nature, Jesus cannot increase in knowledge or wisdom because He is already the absolute fullness of both. He calls Himself “The Truth” in John’s Gospel. (14:6). It is not that He became wiser, little by little, but that little by little He revealed His wisdom. St. Cyril continues, “Because something was to be yielded to the habits of our nature, lest He should be counted strange by those who saw Him, Jesus manifested Himself as a man with a body, gradually advancing in growth, and was daily thought wiser by those who saw and heard Him.”

St. Alphonsus Liguori explains further that from the first moment of His life, Jesus was full of all divine knowledge and wisdom: *In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge* (Colossians 2:3). But it is said that He advanced, because everyday He advanced in age He manifested more and more His sublime wisdom. It is said that He advance in grace with God and men; with God, because all His divine actions, though they did not render Him more holy or increase His merit,-since

Jesus was from the first moment full of sanctity and merit, yet, nevertheless, these operations of the Redeemer were all sufficient in themselves to increase His grace and merit. Alphonsus states that Jesus also advanced in grace with other people. “Oh, how Jesus showed Himself more and more amiable every day of his youth, showing more and more every day the claims He had upon men’s love! With what delight did the holy Youth obey Mary and Joseph! With what recollection of mind did He work! With what moderation did He take his food! With what modesty did He speak! With what sweetness and affability did He converse with all! With what devotion did He pray! In a word, every action, every word, every emotion of Jesus, inflamed with love the hearts of all those who beheld Him, and especially of Mary and of Joseph, who had the good fortune to see Him always at their side. Oh, how these holy spouses remained always intent on contemplating and admiring all the operations, the words, and gestures of this Man-God!” (*The Incarnation, Birth and Infancy of Jesus Christ*).

We too do well to contemplate and admire all the words and deeds of Jesus, especially through the daily Rosary, which is a meditation (with Mary) on the Word of God. When we read the bible we always aim not only at what the text says, but, more importantly, what it means.
