NEW BISHOPS FOR NEW YORK...

Last Sunday night as I was proceeding to lock the church and head home for dinner, the phone rang in the sacristy. I thought it was perhaps someone asking if we had another Mass! What a surprise when I picked up the phone and discovered a Bishop-Elect of the Church - Peter Byrne, on the other end. Father Byrne, along with Father John O'Hara and Msgr. John Jenik will be consecrated as Bishops on August 4th, the Feast Day of Saint John Vianney, and Patron Saint of Parish Priests.

All three men are wonderful pastors and are eminently qualified to be Auxiliary Bishops. Bishop-Elect Byrne and Bishop-Elect O'Hara both served in Staten Island parishes for many years. Bishop-Elect Jenik has served all of his priesthood in parishes in the Bronx. One of the qualifications in being chosen a bishop is that the candidate truly be a "Good Shepherd" of the flock which is the Church.

Pope Francis reminded newly appointed bishops last September that they should not be like "princes" of the Church, ambitious, self-centered careerists! Instead, he emphasized that a good bishop must be immersed in his flock and walk with them always. Having known each of these three men, Father Byrne, Father O'Hara and Msgr. Jenik for many years, I know that they will be true bishops after the Heart of Christ the Good Shepherd.

A question that we might ask is, what is a Bishop? Well, he is first of all a successor of the Twelve Apostles. Every bishop has a three fold teaching mission in the Church - teaching, governing and sanctifying. The three new bishops for New York are called "Auxiliary Bishops." They will not govern their own diocese but rather assist Cardinal Timothy Dolan in the tough job of running the very large Archdiocese of New York.

Bishops receive the Sacrament of Holy

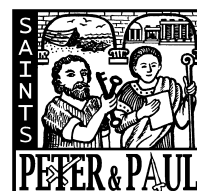
Orders. In fact, when a man receives the Episcopacy, it is said that he has received "the fullness" of the Sacrament of Orders. There are some specific things that bishops can do that priests cannot.

For one, bishops are the Ordinary Ministers of the Sacrament of Confirmation. During the Easter Vigil and throughout the Easter Season, the priest has the permission to Confirm, but outside of that time, the Bishop does it. Bishops Byrne, O'Hara and Jenik will certainly administer the Sacrament of Confirmation many times over the next several years. Secondly, a bishop has the ability by his consecration, to ordain other priests.

A bishop wears a special headdress called a "mitre." The mitre is mentioned in the Old Testament. It was worn by the Jewish High Priests. The staff that the bishop carries is called a "crozier" not a "crow's ear" as one TV commentator called it! The crozier symbolizes the shepherd's staff and the fact that the bishop is truly called to be a "Good Shepherd" of the Church. Finally, a bishop receives a ring on his finger to illustrate that he is wedded to his diocese in a very special way.

To be a bishop in today's Church is certainly not an easy task; in fact it is a very difficult and demanding job. Let us pray for Bishops-Elect Byrne, O'Hara and Jenik. Let us especially petition the Lord that they will effectively shepherd the Church of God here in New York for many years!
