NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners,

Pope Francis writes: "Mary is the woman whose heart was pierced by a sword and who understands all our pain. As mother to all, she is a sign of hope for peoples suffering the birth pangs of justice. She is the missionary who draws near to us and accompanies us throughout life, opening our hearts to faith by her maternal love. As a true mother, she walks at our side, she shares our struggles and she constantly surrounds us with God's love...As she did with Juan Diego, Mary offers them maternal comfort and love, and whispers in their ear: 'Let your heart not be troubled...Am I not here, who am your Mother?'" (*Evangelii Gadium*, 286). As we begin Holy Week we recall that it was during the original Holy Week that God formed our spiritual mother in the kiln of trial and tribulation. She passed through the great furnace of suffering that a mother shares with her agonizing son, which led to that decisive moment in the lives of all Christians when Jesus, dying on the Cross, gave His Mother to the Church through the beloved disciple, who represented each of us, who is a beloved disciple, and said: *Behold your mother*. (John 19:27).

We see the power and love of Mary in the life of James Edward Walsh, who was ordained a priest in 1915 at the Maryknoll Seminary in Ossining, New York. He traveled to China as a missionary in 1918 and eventually became a bishop. He was arrested as a spy in 1958 and subject to a sham trial. He was sixty-seven years old when the sentence was handed down. Describing his ordeal in a book entitled *Zeal for Your House* he spoke of his great sufferings and the ordinary monotony of life in a Chinese prison. He also commented on his unexpected release in 1970: "I felt that I would not live long enough to complete my sentence of twenty years, and that I would die in prison. It is a bit hard for me to believe even now that I have been released. I have no bitterness toward those who tried and condemned me." Bishop Walsh described the power of the Rosary in prison life, which he called his "lifeline". He would pray as many as eighteen per day. His attitude reflects that of Pope Pius XII who once said, "Turn in

spirit with ever greater confidence to the Virgin Mother of God, the constant refuge of Christians in adversity, since she has been made a source of salvation for the human race." (*Ingruentium malorum*, 5).

Some of us at Sacred Heart are suffering major difficulties. All of us have our crosses. A truly excellent source of inner strength is to have recourse to our Lady, who loves us even more than we love ourselves. As we meditate on the great mysteries of our redemption this week, let us behold our mother, who is with us in our trials. Let us cling to her through the most holy Rosary, recited daily.
