# BRING FLOWERS OF THE FAIREST...

This Sunday, May 18<sup>th</sup> after the 11:30 Mass, we will be planting a tree on the lawn in front of the Rectory in honor of Michael DaRocha, a long time Parishioner and member of the Special Events Committee. Michael, who died last year, had many talents. One talent that the Lord blessed him with was a "green thumb." It was Mike who planted all the beautiful flowers around the side of the Church each spring and made the place look so beautiful.

On this day also our Second Grade in all ou children who recently made their First Holy that, I al Communion, will honor the Blessed Mother by Crowning her statue with flowers. The children will sing and old hymn, "Bring Flowers of the Fairest." May is such an appropriate month to honor Mary! Everything is in bloom, the flowers, the trees; the shrubs-nature is reborn.

Thinking of Mike and all his magnificent flowers and the children on Sunday who will present their little floral offerings made me think a bit about a wonderful prayer to Mary that is especially beloved by all Catholics and that is the Holy Rosary. The word "Rosary" really means "Crown of Roses." In the Rosary, we give a "Spiritual Bouquet" to the Blessed Mother every time we pray it.

The Rosary as we know, is composed of the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries. It is a wonderful form of prayer and a great way to reflect upon the events in the life of both Jesus and Mary. Besides the Rosary, there are many prayers, devotions and novenas in honor of Our Lady. Every Catholic Church has a special shrine or a statue of her. The Catholic Church honors Mary in a deep way.

Now, very often some Protestants, especially those of the Fundamentalist variety, object to our Catholic devotion and veneration of the Virgin Mary. They tell us that Christ is

the sole mediator between God and humanityso why even bother invoking the Mother?

Well, the truth is that yes, Jesus is "The Way, The Truth and The Life" and no one can go to the Father except through him. But Mary cooperates in her son's work as mediator! After all, it was she who brought her son in to this world. At the Annunciation, Mary said "yes" to the Angel and the plan of God was fulfilled. Christ physically came from her and thus there is a special bond between them.

Furthermore, Mary now assumed into Heaven, intercedes for all of us poor sinners. There is nothing wrong at all praying to Mary in all our needs and concerns. In line with that, I always think of the Wedding Feast at Cana, where Our Lord performed his First Miracle.

During this wedding party, the wine ran out- a great embarrassment to the hosts. Mary was present at this party and she noted the anxiety of the bride and groom. What did Mary do? She went right to her son Jesus! At first, Our Lord seemed to refuse her request. But Mary trusted that her son Jesus would take care of things. So she simply said to the waiters, do whatever he tells you!" And we know the story- water was changed into wine and the party kept going merrily onward.

From that Gospel we can see evidence of Mary's maternal mediation with her son. So let us take full advantage of that. Whatever form of prayer and devotion it might be, let us give Mary her due because she is our life, our sweetness and our hope!
