GOOD SAINT ANNE...

A couple of months back, through the generosity of one of our Sacred Heart parishioners, Jack Dalton, we received an old statue of St. Anne from the Archdiocesan “warehouse” down at Mount Loretto. As there are now some churches being closed throughout the Archdiocese, many of the artifacts in these churches have been saved, including windows, candles, pews, vestments and of course, many statues.

The statue of St. Anne that we received was from a church in the city. The statue needed some repair, and Gargiulo and Associates did the needed restoration and it looks beautiful! We placed St. Anne’s statue next to that of St. Therese and St. Jude. It is my hope that good St. Anne might watch over our church and our shrines.

Last week a man entered our church and using some kind of a crowbar or other instrument, managed to pry off the tops of all the electric candles and steal money. The Poor Box was ripped off as well. So I thought to myself, we need to pray a little more to Anne and all the other saints for our church and some divine protection!

Who was St. Anne? Well, she was the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The statue in our church depicts Anne with Mary as a young child. Anne therefore is our Lord’s Grandmother! Well, it’s always nice to think of our grandmothers, either living or deceased. Why not take a spiritual grandmother in the person of St. Anne?

There is nothing in the Bible that tells us about St. Anne but there is a non-Biblical source, “The Gospel of James” that relates some details about her life.

Apparently, Anne was born in Bethlehem and she married Joachim, who was from Nazareth. After twenty years of marriage, the couple was childless, and Anne was the subject of ridicule. Joachim fasted and prayed that a

child be born to the couple and his prayers were answered.

An angel appeared to him and told him that God had heard his prayer and that Anne would give birth to a daughter. The couple was to name this child Mary and dedicate her to God. When Mary was born, St. Anne and her husband Joachim did exactly that - they consecrated her to God in the temple where she spent much time in prayer and devotion. When Mary was fourteen years old, her parents betrothed her to St. Joseph, the carpenter from Nazareth and I think we all know the rest of the story!

The name Anne comes from the Hebrew name “Hannah” which means “Grace.” What a grace it is to have devotion to the saints and especially to Anne who was so close to the Blessed Mother! Her Feast Day is on July 26th.

Catholics venerate all the saints with special devotion. They are our heavenly protectors and intercessors. While it is not true in rebuttal to some of our Protestant brethren, that Catholics “worship statues,” having a beautiful image of one of the saints like Anne, the Blessed Mother Mary or the Sacred Heart is something that can move our minds and hearts a little closer to Heaven and spiritual realities - and isn’t that a most important thing? We who are so immersed in the muck and mud of this world need some people to look up to and those people are the saints!

Here is a little prayer to St. Anne that we could say: “Remember, Dear St. Anne, that your name means ‘Grace’. Confident in your power before the throne of grace, we implore your intercession. Share with us the faith, hope and love that made your life a tribute of praise to the Lord God Almighty. May our days be grace filled and secure under your protection! Amen.”
