## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners,

Recently, I celebrated Mass for the Goretti Group of Staten Island. It is a young adult group that emphasizes purity of body and soul, as well as Christian service. During the Mass one of the members gave an inspiring talk about St. Maria Goretti, after whom the group was named. Although she died very young she is an impressive saint, nonetheless.

Maria Goretti was born on October 16, 1890 in Italy, the third of seven children. By the time Maria was six, her family had become so poor that they were forced to share a home with another family, which included Giovanni Serenelli and his son, Alessandro. Soon, her father became very sick with malaria, and died when she was just nine. While her mother and siblings worked in the fields, she would cook, sew, watch her small sister, and keep the house. On July 5, 1902, eleven-year-old Maria was alone with her sister when Alessandro returned to the house and threatened her with a knife if she did not do what he said. He wished to rape her. She refused, protesting that what he wanted to do was a mortal sin and warning him that he would go to Hell. She fought valiantly and kept crying out, "No! It is a sin! God does not want it!!" She insisted she would rather die than submit to him. He stabbed her fourteen times. The next day she died.

Alessandro was captured shortly after the attack and eventually sentenced to 30 years. He was silent and unrepentant for three years, until he had a dream in which Maria gave him fourteen lilies, corresponding to her fourteen wounds, a sign of her forgiveness and a call to change his life. After his release, Alessandro visited Maria's mother, Assunta, and begged her forgiveness. She forgave him, saying that if Maria had forgiven him on her death bed then she could do no less, and they attended Mass the next day, receiving Holy Communion together. He prayed to Maria every day and even attended her canonization in 1950. Alessandro later became a Capuchin brother. He died peacefully in 1970 at the age of 87. At the Canonization in 1950 Pope Pius XII asked the hundreds of thousands of youth in the congregation at the square of St. Peter's: "Young people, pleasure of the eyes of Jesus, are you determined to resist any attack on your chastity with the help of the grace of God?" A resounding "yes" came back to him in response.

St. Maria Goretti is a marvelous witness to both forgiveness and chastity. She reminds us of the

importance of mercifully "letting go and letting God." An important feature of forgiveness is praying for the one who has offended us. A simple prayer each day "Lord I pray for so-and-so..." is the first step towards forgiveness and the inner freedom that comes with forgiveness. It is also important to remind ourselves that we are no better than the one who has harmed us. We would do worse were it not for the grace of God. That kind of humble thinking neutralizes our pride, which causes us to overreact when we are offended.

St. Maria is also a witness to chastity. The teaching of Jesus is clear: sex is very sacred, especially for Christians, *whose bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit*. (Cor. 6:19). Jesus emphasizes that every sexual action must include a unitive and procreative aspect. The unitive aspect means that the action unites a husband and his wife (married in the Church, of course). They express with their bodies what they have done with their lives, namely, given everything they have and are to one another. The procreative aspect means that the action must be open to life. Artificial birth control is immoral. Natural family planning, on the other hand, is wholesome. An important tactic in the midst of lustful temptations is to remind ourselves that we would rather suffer than sin. Why? Because of our love for Jesus. When you truly love someone you would prefer to suffer, rather than see your beloved pained. Jesus is pained when we act lustfully. Rather than offend the One who cares for us so very much, it's better to let the wave of temptation pass by holding our ground, by praying, and by suffering through the provocation. St. James once said: *Resist the Devil and he will flee from you*. (James 4:7). In St. Maria's case, she resisted Alessandro, that evil, and turned him into an angel.
