NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Tomorrow is the feast day of Saint Bernadette Subirous, the visionary of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Lourdes, France. Bernadette died at the age of 35 in 1879. She was a nun of the Sisters of Charity. Her body lies miraculously incorrupt at her convent in Nevers, France.

I recently read a marvelous first-hand account by a man who was a witness of the apparitions at Massabielle, Lourdes in 1858. He did not see the Queen of Heaven—no one but Bernadette did—but he was there with a crowd of the faithful who were praying as Bernadette conversed with the Mother of God for the seventh time during a famous fortnight.

The man's name was Jean-Baptiste Estrade. His two female relatives wanted to see the event out of curiosity. Everyone was talking about it. The ladies needed a male escort because it was still dark in the early morning when the spectacle would occur. He spoke of how he and his companions were skeptically ridiculing the apparitions on the way to the site. One asked mockingly, "Have you brought your opera glasses?" Another answered with a derisive question, "Have you armed yourselves with Holy Water?" Estrade said:

"Bernadette knelt down, pulled out her Rosary from her pocket, and made a profound reverence. All these movements were performed without any awkwardness or self-consciousness, in exactly the same way and as naturally as if the child had gone into the parish church to perform her ordinary devotions. While slipping the first few beads through her fingers, she raised her eyes to the rock in a searching gaze that betrayed her impatient longings. Suddenly, as though a flash of lightning had struck her, she gave a start of amazement, and seemed to be born into another life. Her eyes lighted up and sparkled. Seraphic smiles played on her lips. An indefinable grace spread over her whole being. From within the narrow prison of the flesh, the visionary's soul seemed to be striving to show itself outwardly and

proclaim its jubilation. Bernadette was no longer Bernadette!...

Spontaneously we men who were present uncovered our heads and bent our knees like the humblest woman. The time for argument was past, and we, like all those present at this heavenly scene, were gazing from the ecstatic girl to the rock, and from the rock to the ecstatic. We saw nothing, we heard nothing, needless to say. But what we could see and comprehend was that a conversation had begun between the mysterious Lady and the child whom we had before our eyes. After the first transports caused by the Lady's arrival, the visionary took up the attitude of a listener.

Her face and her gestures reproduced all the phases of a conversation. By turns laughing or serious, Bernadette showed approval with a nod of the head, or seemed herself to be asking questions. When the Lady was speaking, she thrilled with happiness. On the other hand, when she herself was speaking and making her petitions, she would bow down to the ground and be moved to tears. At certain moments it could be seen that the conversation was broken off. Then the child would resume her Rosary, but with her eyes fixed on the rock. You would have said that she was afraid to lower even her eyelids for fear of losing sight of the entrancing object she was gazing at.

The Lady of the rock had veiled herself in vain. I had felt her presence and I was convinced that her motherly gaze had hovered over my head. It was a most solemn hour of my life! I was thrown almost into a delirium of madness by the thought that a cynical, sneering, self-satisfied fellow like me had been permitted to come so close to the Queen of Heaven....

Most of the crowd had already left Massabielle while we remained motionless, bareheaded, abashed and dumbfounded. We proceeded to the ravine and made our way up it in complete silence: a great change was being wrought in us. Our prejudices were collapsing. At last, giving free rein to our emotions that we had so far restrained, we exclaimed in turn: 'It's prodigious! It's sublime! It's divine!'"

Collection for Church in Eastern & Central

Europe: Every year the Archdiocese of New York takes up a special collection for the Church in Eastern and Central Europe. During the many years of communist rule practicing the faith became illegal and people had to share secretly the truths of the Gospels. Still to this day Catholics in the region struggle to rebuild places of worship as well as Church ministries and communities. This collection is crucial in providing resources to countries struggling to breathe new life into the faith once again. For example in Tirana, the capital city of Albania, the people are trying not only to restore structures but also the spirituality of the faithful Catholics in that country. In 1996 a congregation of Nuns established a kindergarten, the very first Catholic school ever in Tirana. Since then, with your continued help, they have established a Catholic School for kids grades 1-9. They have also created daily activity centers for children which serve over 700 children from all different faiths and ethnic groups. On the weekend of April 28th & 29th a special collection will be taken up for this cause. Please be as generous as your means will allow and remember that your donations have and always will be valued.
