NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners,

As you know, the current church year is designated: "The Year of Mercy." One of my favorite stories of mercy involves Pope St. John Paul II. A New York priest who spent his seminary years in Rome was in the Eternal City on a pilgrimage. He was traveling to a semi-private audience with John Paul. Such a gathering usually involved a couple of hundred people in a meeting room at the Vatican. Following an address by the Holy Father, a line of pilgrims would form to shake his hand and receive a souvenir, usually a blessed Rosary. The N.Y. priest was walking toward St. Peter's Basilica for the audience when he caught sight of a man that he recognized. The man was homeless. "Ci conosciamo, no?" Don't we know each other? The homeless man said, "Si." Certainly he knew that priest. He himself was a priest and the two men had studied together in Rome. What happened? How did he end up begging on the streets of Rome? Drugs. Addictions touch every class of human beings, don't they? After a short conversation, the N.Y. priest, stupefied from learning of the plight of his classmate, continued his trek to the Vatican.

After the audience, when it was his turn to personally greet the Pontiff, he decided to tell the Pope about the homeless priest. The Holy Father too, was stupefied. He invited both priests to a private dinner in the papal apartment that evening with himself and his secretary, who is currently the cardinal archbishop of Krakow, Poland. The N.Y. priest went searching throughout the city to locate the homeless priest. After a few hours he finally found him and presented to him that very special invitation. The homeless priest protested, "How can I go to dinner with the Pope? I haven't showered in a week. I stink. I have no presentable clothing." The N.Y. priest assured him that there were shops all over Rome that sold church goods and so he could buy him some clerical clothing. Moreover, he could shower at his hotel room. When the homeless priest continued to manifest reluctance the N.Y. priest said, "Look! You're my ticket to a private dinner with the Holy Father

himself. Let's get going!" He complied.

After the main course of the dinner, the Pope indicated to the N.Y. priest and his secretary to leave him alone with the homeless priest. They were together for about a half hour. Then the other two returned for dessert. Later on, the N.Y. priest learned what conspired between the Pontiff and his companion. The Pope asked the homeless priest to hear his Confession. The priest objected. He said, "I haven't heard a Confession in years! Besides, I no longer have faculties to hear confessions. After all, I have been out of the priesthood for a long time." The Pope answered, "You know, I happen to be the Bishop of Rome. I can give you faculties right now." The homeless priest continued, "But I am a beggar, Holy Father!" The Pope responded, "So am I." The priest heard the Pope's Confession and then the Pope heard his Confession. Afterwards, John Paul reinstated him to full-time priestly ministry and assigned him to one of the poorest parishes in the city of Rome, a church with many homeless people in the neighborhood. The Holy Father said to him, "I want you to minister to our fellow beggars."
