NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Father Jacques Philippe is a French spiritual author. He speaks about that interior calm that we so very much desire. He writes:

“The quest for interior peace is much more than the search for peace of mind. It really is about something else: opening ourselves up to God’s actions. It’s important to understand a simple but spiritually important truth: the more we reach out toward peace, the more the grace of God is capable of acting in our lives. Like a tranquil lake perfectly reflects the sun, so is a peaceful heart receptive to the action and movement of the Spirit.”

This advice is consistent with what the great spiritual director, Saint Francis de Sales, said in one of his letters to someone that he was instructing. He wrote, “The Devil is ever solicitous to banish peace from your mind, knowing well that God dwells there only in peace, and that it is in peace that He works His wonders.”

Fr. Philippe continues, “Remaining calm in the face of trouble, uneasiness, and interior disturbances is necessary in order for God to act in our lives. We can still grow in love, and our lives can have the fruitfulness we are called to have if we can accomplish this inward peace...When we’re preoccupied by worry, disturbed by events in our lives, our emotions can get the best of us and we don’t have an objective grasp on reality—we are tempted to see everything in black and white, and question everything in our life. On the other hand, when we are at peace we see life clearly...We should adopt the following rule of conduct: when a problem has robbed us of our peace, the most

important thing is not to resolve the problem in the hope of regaining our peace, but to regain a minimum of peacefulness, and then to see what we can do to face the problem.” [*Fire and Light: Eucharistic Love and the Search for Peace* (2016)].

I think Fr. Philippe does well to emphasize the importance of maintaining peace. After all, our Savior corrected His servant once, “Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing.” (Luke 10:41). He also commanded us not to worry: “Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span?” (Matthew 6:27). Moreover, throughout the Easter Season we hear Him saying in the Liturgy of the Word at Mass: “Peace be with you”. Our God is a meek, calm and gentle God. When our soul is in a similar condition only then can we hear His voice and understand His language and reflect His love.

Collection for Church in Eastern & Central

Europe: Every year the Archdiocese of New York takes up a special collection for the Church in Eastern and Central Europe. During the many years of communist rule practicing the faith became illegal and people had to share secretly the truths of the Gospels. Still to this day Catholics in the region struggle to rebuild places of worship as well as Church ministries and communities. This collection is crucial in providing resources to countries struggling to breathe new life into the faith once again. For example in Tirana, the capital city of Albania, the people are trying not only to restore structures but also the spirituality of the faithful Catholics in that country. In 1996 a congregation of Nuns established a kindergarten, the very first Catholic school ever in Tirana. Since then, with your continued help, they have established a Catholic School for kids grades 1-9. They have also created daily activity centers for children which serve over 700 children from all different faiths and ethnic groups. On the weekend of April 28th & 29th a special collection will be taken up for this cause. Please be as generous as your means will allow and remember that your donations have and always will be valued.
