NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A relevant topic was broached in the recent article, "My Kids Think They Don't Have To Go To Church Because Their Dad Doesn't. What Can I Do?" by Katrina Fernandez. [Aleteia.org, April 12, 2018]. A woman featured in the article was seeking advice. She is a mother whose children think they should not be required to go to church because their father does not attend Mass. The woman knew that her husband was not faithful to Mass when she married him. Back then she was not very religious herself. However, once the children came, it became important to her to raise them Catholic. The couple decided that the mother would handle all matters religious. When the children were toddlers the couple managed the situation with minimum tension, but now the children, 9 and 13, don't want to go Mass anymore. They think it's not fair that Mom makes them go when Dad gets to stay home. Fernandez charitably reminds the mother that it is possible that the father is simply unaware of how much impact his inaction on the matter has or how much of a contradiction he is creating.

This is a very real concern for us Catholics because, as Fernandez points out, an essential factor in whether children will grow up to be regular church attenders depends heavily on whether or not their father was a regular church attender himself. Fathers have a huge role in the spiritual upbringing of their children. A recent study demonstrated that if the father is non-practicing and the mother regularly practicing Sunday Mass, only 2 percent of children will become regular worshipers, and 37 percent will attend irregularly. The study points out that over 60 percent of such children will be lost completely to the Church.

Years later, if and when the children veer into gross immorality because they were not trained in the fear of the Lord, the religiously negligent parent will cringe at the idea that he was a major player in this tragedy. Moreover, the marriage will suffer even now as the father's lack of interest in God and godliness profoundly undermines the mother's hard work in trying to

lead her children to Christ. Parents must work together as a team. His poor example sends an unmistakable message to his children that Jesus is not all that important. On the contrary, Jesus calls Himself the way, the truth and the life (John 14:6). He also points out that the Eucharist is absolutely essential and necessary: Unless you eat My flesh and drink My Blood, you will not have eternal life. (John 6:53).

This issue is a real dilemma. On the one hand people are on different spiritual journeys and we should be gentle with those who may not have received the graces we have received and who do not understand the implications of their bad choices. The Apostle says: We who are strong ought to put up with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves. (Romans 15:1). Hence, from this point of view, perhaps the mother should tolerate her husband's Mass missing passively.

On the other hand, what about the spiritual damage that he is encouraging? Missing Mass without a good reason, such as illness, is a mortal sin. Our Lord once said: Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. (Matthew 18:6). Fernandez tells the mother, "For him to relinquish his parental responsibilities in this matter simply because he chooses not to practice his faith is totally unacceptable and you are well within your rights to point this out to him. In hindsight, the arrangement you made when the kids were younger is no longer working. It's not unreasonable at all to suggest the arrangement have some new terms."

If we find ourselves in this family situation, or something similar, we do well to think about it. God has given the great gift of human reason. We should make good use of it. Then we should pray about it and wait. There's no rush. St. James said, "Everyone should be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath. Then we do well to consult with wise and discreet people who think with Christ and His Church. Lastly, go with the heart. The answer will be there because that is where Jesus speaks.
