



GOSPEL JN 20: 1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

A Note from The Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Praised be Jesus Christ! There's a poster featuring the pictures of four U.S. presidents: Lincoln, Truman, Eisenhower and FDR. The title of the poster is: "If At First You Don't Succeed You're In Good Company." The theme of the poster seems to be failure, really. It indicates that Abe Lincoln owned a dry goods store as a young man that went bankrupt. Then he became the postmaster of his township, which during his tenure had the very worst efficiency record in the nation. Roosevelt flunked out of law school. Ike was rejected three times for command positions before he became the Supreme Allied Commander in World War II in 1942. Lastly, Truman opened up a clothing store when he was 35. It went bankrupt and he worked 15 years to pay off the debt.

Do you know who was a real failure in the eyes of His contemporaries? A fellow by the name of Jesus of Nazareth. He worked for three years or so preaching and teaching night and day to establish a new kingdom. Instead of a crown of gold He received a crown of thorns. For a regal scepter He was given a reed. Instead of a silk, embroidered purple robe of royalty He was given a robe of scorn in mockery. Instead of homage He received insults, spit, blows, scourges and taunts. His throne was a cross. And then His body was buried in a borrowed tomb.

Even from the point of view of His closest friends and associates He was a failure. One of the Twelve Apostles betrayed Him. His right-hand-man denied three times that he even knew Him. Two of His disciples on the road to Emmaus admitted shortly after His death that they had given up all hope in Him and in His cause.

Based upon His own words at the end of His life (if one was ignorant of our Faith) one could be justified in concluding that even Jesus considered Himself a failure. What were some of His last words on earth? "My soul is sorrowful even unto death." "Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me." "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" Are these the words of a man who is convinced He has been successful?

If it were not for one historical fact Jesus Christ would indeed have been a colossal failure. This fact changed failure into success, defeat into victory. This historical fact is the Resurrection. St. Paul once said: *If Christ has not been raised your faith is vain; you are still in your sins.* (1 Corinthians 15:17).

Although Jesus may have been regarded by the world as well as by His friends as a failure, yet He was never a failure in the eyes of His heavenly Father. We too may be regarded as a failure in the eyes of the world, of our friends, even in our own eyes. We may have failed in business. Perhaps our marriage is not so great. Maybe a child of ours has real issues and we blame ourselves. Perhaps our body is a failure because of sickness or accident. Worst of all, we may be a moral failure. We may be enslaved to some habit of sin that we just can't seem to break free of. For some of us, this vice may have nearly ruined our family.

The Resurrection is a reminder that because we belong to Jesus Christ (blessed be His Name) we too rise from our dead selves by His power. As we are one with Christ our failures are transformed into victories. Our bodies may be broken down but our souls will live forever. Our family lives here on earth may be lacking yet we are deeply-cared about, essential members of God's family. Our businesses may be shattered but we have mounds and mounds of treasure in Heaven. We may be in lackluster jobs but we are the body of Christ, part of the ultimate enterprise, the corporation par excellence, the Catholic Church, which aids the neediest here on earth like no one else, and which leads people to Paradise-in fact, there is no salvation outside the Church. Our level of virtue may be low but we borrow His holiness and little by little He makes us perfect, transforming us into His image, so that one day we will shine for all eternity. Indeed, because we belong to Jesus Christ, we are never a failure in the eyes of our heavenly Father. On the contrary. We are the apple of His eye.


