## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

In today's second reading from the twelfth chapter of the *Letter to the Hebrews* the Apostle says: *Let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us.* The Catholic Church has a mechanism by which to "rid ourselves," and this is Confession. When was the last time you went to Confession?

This Sacrament, also known as Penance or Reconciliation, was instituted late on the original Easter Sunday. The Evangelist tells us: *On the evening of that first day of the week when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."* (John 20:19-23).

Priests, as successors of the Apostles, are given the extraordinary power to take away sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If the penitent is sorry or contrite for his sins, confesses those sins, and has the intention to complete the penance given to him during the Confession, then he can be certain that his sins are forgiven when the priest says, "... and I absolve you of your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." What a freedom!

St. John Vianney, who knew plenty about this Sacrament, since he usually heard Confessions sixteen to eighteen hours a day,

said once in a homily, "Tell me, is it against your inclination to go to Confession? But, my dear friend, is it possible to find a greater happiness than that in less than three minutes our eternity of misery should be changed into an eternity of bliss? Does not Confession restore us to the friendship of God? Does not Confession quench in us the remorse which is an unceasing agony to us? Does it not restore peace to our souls and renew our hope of Heaven? Does not Jesus Christ at this moment appear to unfold to us the riches of His infinite mercy? Yes, my devout children, how many more of the damned would there be, and how far fewer Saints, if we had not this Sacrament? Oh, how the Saints in Heaven thank Our Blessed Lord that He has instituted this Sacrament!" (*Sermon for the Twenty-Fourth Sunday After Pentecost*, "Seek the Kingdom of Heaven.").

When was the last time that you went to Confession?

**Summertime!** A great time to look at some challenges before us— A growing concern/question I am often asked is “Why are many of the hymnbooks/missals in disrepair? “What is being done about this?”

**A Bit of History:** In 2004, The Parish Choir and I embarked on a Herculean fundraiser (via a year long concert series, including a hymnbook dedication as part of the ticket purchase). As a result of hundreds and hundreds (and hundreds!) of hours of painstaking work and great generosity from parishioners, we were able to purchase 400 hymnbooks/missals (in addition to 50 choir books thanks to a generous Parish Choir member!) - permanently replacing the need to purchase an equal number of disposable missalettes yearly!

**The Good News/Bad News:** The good news is we have saved the church over \$108,000 over the last 12 years by using our beloved hymnbooks, in lieu of disposable missalettes (not to mention the hundreds of trees saved in the process!). Additionally, of course, is the priceless devotional comfort for those who worship weekly, using the book dedicated to their loved one. The history of deceased members/family members of this parish live on in our hymnbook/missal dedications!

**The Bad News:** And so it is we are challenged on many levels as how best to meet the ever growing need of addressing our deteriorating books!! Approximately 1/3 of the books need serious repair and/or replacement. Book binding repairs will usually cost more than a new book (New book—approx. \$16-\$26). Additionally our edition of Journey Songs is no longer in print (due to English revision of the Mass several years ago).

So if we purchase “new”, we need to purchase all new books (approx. \$8500)! Ideas? Checks anyone? Pamela and the Choirs (VM 24) 718-442-0058
