NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In “How to Defuse a Child’s Tantrum With One Question,” Fabiana Santos speaks about a subject that is thoroughly familiar to parents everywhere. (*Aleteia.org*, January 29, 2018.). Her five-year-old daughter, Alice, started kindergarten and she was nervous. She continuously insisted that she could not keep up. At home she kept throwing tantrums with the slightest provocation, even over the most minute and meaningless things. The school administration recommended that the child begin to see a psychologist so that she could talk about what she was feeling and eventually calm down.

The psychologist selected was Sally Neuberger. She explained to Mrs. Santos that parents do well to make children feel respected by acknowledging what they are feeling. In the time of a flare-up parents need to help children (ages 5 and up) understand what is going on. When the parent acknowledges what the child is experiencing and, at the same time, invites him or her to help solve the problem, the tantrum can be neutralized.

Santos explains, “When a tantrum starts — either because the doll’s arm came off, or because it’s time to go to bed, or because the homework did not come out the way she wanted, or because he did not want to do a chore — whatever the reason, we can ask them the following question, looking into their eyes and in a calm voice: “Is this a big problem, a medium problem, or a small problem?”

Santos found real positive results as Alice was trained to actively and sincerely think about what was going on around her. After asking the question, mom and daughter then find a way to solve the problem. A small problem is always quick and simple to solve, but more weighty matters need time. Her daughter began to understand the difference. “If a problem is serious — and obviously what is serious from a

child’s point-of-view is not something to be dismissed, even though it may seem silly to us — you might need to talk it over more and help her understand that sometimes there are things that do not go exactly the way we want.”

Fabiana gave an example of this novel approach to calming her daughter’s nerves. On one occasion, she and her child were choosing clothes for school. Her daughter wanted to wear her favorite pair of pants, but they were in the wash. Alice started to melt down and so Fabiana asked, “Alice, is this a big, medium, or small problem?” She looked at her mom sheepishly and said quietly, “Small.” Fabiana explained to Alice that they already knew that small problems are easy to solve. Then she asked Alice for her suggestions on how they would solve that small problem. It is always important to give the child time to think and respond. Subsequently, Alice answered, “Choosing other pants.” Fabiana answered, “And you have more than one pair of pants to choose from.” Alice smiled and went to find another pair of pants. Fabiana congratulated Alice on having solved the problem herself because, she learned, valuing the solution is an essential aspect of finishing off the story.

After reading this article, I thought that perhaps adults could adopt this approach. When something doesn’t go our way we may ask ourselves: “Is this a big problem, a medium problem, or a small problem?” and then proceed accordingly.

Lenten Regulations:

1. Lent is a special season of prayer, penance and Christian charity.
2. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as fasting, allowing only one full meal. A special dispensation for abstinence has been given for Friday, March 17th, in honor of St. Patrick’s Day.
3. The other Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat. The obligation of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday obliges all Catholics ages 21-59. The obligation of abstinence obliges all Catholics from age 14 onward. Those whose health would be impaired are excused from physical mortifications.
4. The Fridays outside of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat. Other acts of penance such as temperance, personal prayer, daily Mass and self denial may be substituted for abstinence.
