NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

History buffs will recall that just about a hundred years ago (January 10, 1917) William Cody died in Denver, Colorado and was buried near Lookout Mountain in the same state. He was more commonly known as "Buffalo Bill". Cody was a legend of the Wild West. He was the Chief of Scouts of the Seventh Kansas Cavalry, who also served as a guide for the U.S. Army and the Pacific Railroad. Buffalo Bill got his nickname from his prowess as a buffalo hunter in the prairies of the American West. Eventually his fame led to him traveling throughout the world to entertain the masses with his circus and variety show called "The Buffalo Bill Wild West Show."

Cody traveled from one city to another by train. His show would be assembled in wide open spaces and would include a riveting simulation of the battle of Little Big Horn, and the reenactment of the famous hand-to-hand combat between Buffalo Bill himself and Chief Yellow Hand. His presentations gained thousands of spectators.

On March 3, 1890, Bill entertained the Italians. He was denied access to the famous Coliseum in Rome, and so he set up the spectacle on an open field not far from the Vatican. At the time, Cody asked for an audience with Pope Leo XIII, but his request was rejected because he wanted to bring his enormous entourage, but later Cody himself and some of his companions were allowed to view Leo's entrance into the Sala Ducale, as the pope was taken into the Sistine Chapel.

The following day the New York Herald reported: "One of the strangest events ever to occur within the austere walls of the Vatican was the sensational entry made this morning by Buffalo Bill leading his cowboys and Indians (...) among the immortal frescoes of Michelangelo and Raphael, and in the midst of the oldest Roman aristocracy, suddenly a band of savages appeared, their faces painted, covered with feathers and arms, armed with axes and knives (...) Suddenly, a beautiful and chivalrous figure appeared. It was Colonel William F. Cody, Buffalo Bill. He greeted the Camerlengo with a gesture and took a step through the ranks of the guards."

The press also pointed out that the Indians who accompanied the Pope were overwhelmed with emotion on seeing the Vicar of Christ. One of them greeted the Pope's arrival by shouting, and then, after solemnly kneeling to ask for his blessing, he rose and started screaming again. Most of the American Indians who accompanied Cody were Catholics. Some chroniclers wrote that Leo XIII gently smiled.

The Denver Museum still preserves today the gifts that Leo XIII gave Buffalo Bill and his entourage: rosaries and medals of his pontificate. After the visit in 1890, Cody would take his show to Florence and other Italian cities. On January 9, 1917, the day before his death Buffalo Bill renounced Free Masonry and became a Catholic. Father Christopher Walsh performed the Baptism.

Was it the encounter with Pope Leo XIII and his pontifical blessing that would eventually push Bill into the arms of Jesus? Was it the prayers of the devout Indian Catholics who formed his show? Was it the example of Mother (St. Frances Xavier) Cabrini, who had founded several orphanages in his own city of Denver? Perhaps it was a combination of causes. In any event, the work of Jesus in bringing beloved souls into His Kingdom is certainly a mystery.
