# NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

# Dear Parishioners:

With both the *Women's March* and the *Right to Life March* behind us perhaps we can view the connection between early feminists and abortion. Actually, the heroines and founding mothers of the feminist movement were pro-life.

Marjorie Dannenfelser points out that Susan B. Anthony campaigned, above all, for women's rights to equal economic and political opportunity, not for the right to have abortion on demand. "Early feminists opposed abortion because it took human life, because women were pressured by economics and by male partners to do something they didn't want to do, and because they believed the vital right to control one's own body could not include the right to destroy someone else's." ("Pro-Life Feminists are Old School." National Review. 20 Jan. 2017). The newspaper she owned and ran with Elizabeth Cady Stanton actually refused to carry ads for abortifacients, and published numerous articles from feminist leaders condemning abortion.

Mary Wollstonecraft, one of the first feminist philosophers, wrote *A Vindication of the Rights of Woman*. In the book, she criticized women who, owing to their powerless position, "have not sufficient strength to discharge the first duty of a mother; and sacrificing to lasciviousness the parental affection, that ennobles instinct, either destroy the embryo in the womb, or cast it off when born."

Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell was the very first female physician. She deeply opposed abortion. She wrote in her diary: "The gross perversion and destruction of motherhood by the abortionist filled me with indignation." Other early feminist physicians, including Dr. Charlotte Lozier, agreed.

Sarah F. Norton, who, with Susan B. Anthony, successfully persuaded Cornell University to admit women in 1870, wrote that "perhaps there will come a time when an unmarried mother will not be despised because of her motherhood . . . and when the right of the unborn to be born will not be denied or interfered with."

Dannenfelser writes, "Some scholars have attempted to say that those who point out these facts are engaging in 'revisionist history,' but how many pioneering 19th-century women have had their opposition to abortion shamefully edited out of their biographies and Wikipedia entries because too many modern-day feminists are embarrassed by the suffragists' pro-life views?"

The church has always upheld the absolute dignity of women, and yet we are also pro-life. Everyone is sacred from the womb to the tomb. Today, if you are pro-life some powerful voices accuse you of being anti-woman. However, Dannenfelser says correctly, "A commitment to the equal dignity of women is not consistent with insisting on a 'right' to destroy life. The organizers of the Women's March in Washington are engaging in a similar act of revisionism when they refuse to let a pro-life women's group march with them — excluding from their concern not only this group, but the millions of American women, young and old, conservative and liberal, Republican and Democratic, who reject the cruelty inherent in the idea that women's rights include the right to kill our developing children."
