## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Recently, at a weekday homily, Pope Francis spoke of the problems of underpopulation. The Holy Father said God's first commandment to man was to fill the earth and be fruitful! "Where there is God, there is fruitfulness," he said. "Fruitfulness is always a blessing of God." Yet, today, many couples all over the world are having fewer children. The birth rates in many countries have sunk below replacement levels, prompting worries about future economies and care of the elderly.

The Pope distinguished between those who choose not to have children for selfish reasons and those who choose to be celibate to serve others. "He who lives for himself produces selfishness, pride, vanity, greasing the soul without living for others," he said. Today, the pontiff observed, a corrosive mentality has pervaded the world: the notion that barrenness is a benefit — even virtuous. Many couples are choosing childlessness to maintain their own "economic well-being." The endpoint of this self-absorption, the Pope asserted is "countries empty of children." Having "chosen the path of sterility," they "suffer from that grave disease ... a demographic winter."

Underpopulation is not merely a concern of the Church. A 2012 United Nations study warned that the "most serious impact of aging populations would be in developing countries without safety nets or adequate legal protection in place for older people." The study advocated reforms of Social Security-type insurance and pensions for the elderly. "Informal support systems for older persons are increasingly coming under stress, as a consequence, among others, of lower fertility, out-migration of the young, and women working outside the home," the UN report stated. We might also mention legalized abortion, which takes the lives of millions of unborn babies across the world each year. In India 15.6 million babies were aborted in 2015 alone.

Pope Francis described children as a "blessing" that the Devil is trying to destroy. "The Devil wants infertility. He does not want us to give life, be it physical or spiritual, to others." Pointing to the Old Testament, Francis noted children were considered a blessing and childlessness a curse. "Infertility was a disgrace; not being able to bear

children, not being able to have descendants," he noted. The Holy Father is correct. Childlessness was a painful cross in those days. Think of Hannah, weeping because of her barrenness before Eli the priest. God, in His mercy, would remedy her infertility through her pregnancy with Samuel, who would eventually become a great prophet. Remember Rachel, wife of Jacob, also called Israel. *When Rachel saw that she had not born children to Jacob, she became envious of her sister. She said to Jacob, "Give me children or I shall die!"* (Genesis 30:1).

The Biblical witness to the absolute value of children is undeniable. In Psalm 127 the prophet says, *Certainly sons are a gift from the LORD, the fruit of the womb, a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the sons born in one's youth. Blessed is the man who has filled his quiver with them. He will never be shamed for he will destroy his foes at the gate.* (127:3-5). When Esau met Jacob in the wilderness after a long absence Esau saw the large family of his twin brother and asked, "*Who are these with you?*" Jacob answered, "*They are the children with whom God has graciously favored your servant.*" (Genesis 33:5). Even the good Lord Himself, our blessed Savior, spoke of the great gift of childbearing when He said: *When a woman is in labor, she is in anguish because her hour has arrived; but when she has given birth to a child, she no longer remembers the pain because of her joy that a child has been born into the world.* (John 16:21).

Children are a great gift! Perhaps the greatest gift we can gift to them is to live our lives in a holy and virtuous fashion. It gives them a good example to emulate. They see Christ at work in us and hopefully fall in love with Him. Moreover, our gentle God blesses the children for the sake of their righteous parents. The wise man speaks of this in the Book of Proverbs (20:7). He says: *The just walk in integrity; happy are their children after them!* (NAB translation). Another translation: *The righteous who walks in his integrity— blessed are his children after him!* (ESV).
