NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Cerith Gardiner writes about a beautiful, but short, marriage in “The Last Words of a Dying Bride.” (Aleteia.org, 5 January 2018). On December 23, 2016, Heather Mosher from Connecticut, received the overwhelming news that she had breast cancer. How did David Mosher, her boyfriend, react? He took her in a horse-drawn carriage and proposed to her under a street light. David said, “She didn’t know I was going to propose that night, but I said to myself, she needs to know she’s not going to go down this road alone.” Over the following year, Heather battled the disease with David’s constant support, sympathy and encouragement. The cancer then spread to her brain and within a few months Heather needed life support just to breathe. “She was tough. Anyone else would have given up a long time ago. The doctors even said we don’t know how she’s still here,” David said.

Cancer was not going to overcome the couple’s love and intention to marry. Although they had planned to exchange vows at church on December 30, doctors quietly advised David to move the date forward. Hence, on December 22, the couple said their vows in front of their family and friends at the St. Francis chapel of the hospital.

“We were losing her as we were all standing there, thinking, to hold onto this, because this was the last she had to give,” said Heather’s bridesmaid, Christina Karas. There’s a wonderful photo of the bride immediately after the exchange of vows with outstretched arms manifesting her overflowing joy. She was “jubilant” in being able to proclaim her love for the man “who didn’t abandon her in her time of need.”

Karas stated solemnly, “The last words she said were her vows.”

David the groom declared: “She’s my great love, and I’m going to lose her, but I’m not losing her forever.” Just 18 hours later, on December 23, a year to the day she became engaged, Heather died a married woman.

Gardiner, the author of this article, points out a very important truth, explaining, “Heather’s story is what a wedding is all about. Not an expensive dress, flowers, and the perfect venue, but declaring your love and commitment to that someone special, and showing them that you will be by their side as you navigate life’s journey together, no matter how long, or short.”

At Sacred Heart Church in Staten Island, there are many spouses who have embodied these noble sentiments. I believe they are giving much glory to God by fulfilling their sacred vows with great love, reflecting in their own marital unions the perpetual love that Jesus Christ has for His bride, the Church. Moreover, these couples are doing much for society. After all, marriage is the foundation of family. Family is the cornerstone of civilization. We thank the married couples of our parish for their witness.
