NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Lisa Bourne wrote about Clarence Thomas in her article, “U.S. Supreme Court Justice: Daily Mass Helps Me Do My Job The ‘Right Way’.” (*LifeSiteNews*, January 15, 2018). Catholic Justice Clarence Thomas goes to Mass before work every day because it gives him the “strength to do what I have to do every day.” Thomas, who is African-American, said in a recent interview that daily Mass helps him do his “job, a secular job, in the right way and for the right reasons.” Faith in God, he said, “gives you the wisdom, the insights, the capacity to do the work, to decide these [important legal issues], the discipline. It gives content and meaning to the oath I took. At the end of my oath — and for this job I had to take two — you say ‘So help me God.’ It’s an oath to God. So, if you have a strong faith in God, then that oath gains in meaning and content.”

Thomas’s father left the family when he was two, and his mother struggled to pay the bills. Then further tragedy struck. They lost their house to a fire. In response, Thomas’s grandfather took the family in when he was seven. The grandparents sent their grandson to an all-black Catholic school run by Caucasian nuns, who taught Thomas about the inestimable value of the Catholic faith. Thomas said that his illiterate grandfather instilled in him the virtues of humility, patience, and persistence. His granddad would often tell him, “Boy, you have to stand up for what you believe in.” Thomas honestly believes that the course of his family life, through poverty, illiteracy and dysfunction, which somehow led him to the United States Supreme Court, has been an unmitigated grace—a function of divine providence.

Justice Thomas is a hero to so many Catholics. He is well-known for his courageous and wise judicious opinions upholding life, marriage and the Constitution. He has maintained his integrity, firmness and gentleness in spite of bitter opposition from many in the media and the entertainment industry. For instance, his dissenting opinion on a homosexual “marriage” case in July 2015 led to an angry condemnation by a famous openly gay actor, who called Thomas “a clown in blackface sitting on the Supreme Court.”

Justice Thomas said in the interview that he often recites the Catholic Litany of Humility prayer to maintain focus and perspective on worldly things. What ultimately matters, he said, is to do what we are called to do. He is correct. Every one of us has a specific mission to accomplish in our work and a set of relationships to cultivate. Thomas is very grateful for his Catholic Faith. He said it gives him “the strength to do what I have to do every day, to assert the independence, to be willing to take the beatings, the criticism, the unfairness.”

Like Justice Thomas, many Catholics throughout the world wisely attend daily Mass. Their schedule allows for it. They recognize that the twenty-five minutes or so dedicated to the Eucharist cannot be spent in a better way. Jesus has gifts to give us that He does not give except at Mass. We have so much to receive at the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist. We have so much to give as well. If we want to give Jesus a gift, in recognition for all that He has given us, we do well to come to the Altar. Once, St. Teresa of Ávila was overwhelmed with God’s Goodness and asked Our Lord “How can I thank you?” Our Blessed Savior replied, “Attend one Mass.”
