NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

Cardinal Dolan wrote to the clergy of the Archdiocese of New York recently and spoke of how he was fascinated by the results of a study of our Catholic people in the archdiocese by a research organization known as the *Global Strategy Group*. At the invitation of His Eminence, they did some professional polling about the sentiments of our people regarding the Church so as to help us in our pastoral strategy.

He summarized the group's findings by saying, "There is good news, sobering news, and challenges." Those who regularly attend Sunday Mass, which other studies tell us is about 24% of baptized adult Catholics, report they are "very happy" with the Church, and "consider God, faith, and the Church the center of my life." The bad news is that 5% of the respondents claimed "to be done" with the Church. The rest, while admitting they had "drifted," still expressed a "connection" with the Church, especially at what the researchers tagged "life's inflection points," such as births, marriages, transitions, sickness, growth of kids and grandchildren, feasts, deaths of loved ones, and facing their own. When asked why they needed the Church, Catholics gave three answers: a sense of community and belonging; the need for purpose and focus in a hectic life; and the Eucharist.

Family was very important to the respondents of the survey. They want parishes that nurture and sustain families and children. Therefore, they consider Catholic schools, religious education programs, child care, and a community that welcomes families with kids, very significant. Our Catholics look for "friends" at Church, thus savoring a warm, welcoming atmosphere, and are much more inclined to return to Church, or get more involved, when a friend encourages them. As for the leaders in the Church, they enjoy a certain level of popularity with the people. Pope Francis received an 88%

approval rate, their pastors 79%. The Cardinal himself rated 76%.

What were their criticisms of our religion? The study determined that there is a major obstacle to our people's more vibrant commitment to the faith, and, especially, to faithful Sunday Mass attendance. What would that be? The Cardinal quipped, "Take a guess: Women's ordination? The abuse crisis? Divorce and remarriage? No, no, no. Their answer? *They are too busy!* There are too many other competing demands, distractions, and duties, and, when they choose, the Church usually loses." The respondents also report as an impediment to Sunday Mass their inability to understand the priest; a sense among young families that the "older congregation" finds them and their children a distraction; and that the Church buildings are uncomfortable and in need of repair.

As I read this article I thought of the importance of transparency. Therefore, I invite you to let me know if there is some way(s) in which, in your opinion, we can improve things at Sacred Heart. I would be quite receptive to your message—I'm all ears!
