## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

This Tuesday is the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Imagine being the grandparents of the Lord Christ Himself! Plenty is written about them, but much more is uttered about their daughter.

Blessed Amadeus of Lausanne, Switzerland, a French 12<sup>th</sup> century bishop, offers a beautiful meditation on our blessed Lady. He says:

“The wisdom of the Father clung round her neck and in her arms rested the Power that moves all things. The little Jesus stood on His Mother’s lap and in her Virgin bosom rested that rest of holy souls. Sometimes tilting His head while she held him with right hand or left, He bent His gentle gaze upon His Mother, He whom angels longed to look upon, and called her Mother with sweet murmurs, He whom every spirit calls in time of need.

Filled with the Holy Spirit she clasped the sacred breast of her Son to her own breast and pressed His face to hers. Sometimes she kissed His hands and arms and trustingly, with a mother’s privilege, took sweet kisses from His sacred mouth. She was not sated with beholding Him nor satisfied with hearing Him. Him many kings and prophets desired to see and saw not, and to hear and heard not.

She progressed further and further in love, and her spirit burning in her ever-wakeful soul was fixed upon His divine

glances. For love of her Son she feared neither toil nor grief nor dangers nor poverty nor want, neither terrors nor death nor the rage of the wicked king, the flight and return from Egypt. She was most pleasing in her activity, full of joy in what she did, prompt in obedience, devoted in her service, humble in her submission. In everything she acted with success; she ordered all things vigorously and wisely.” (*Eight Homilies on the Praises of Blessed Mary*, 1979)

We too yearn to be free from fear, full of joy, prompt in obedience, devoted and humble. Why? Because we understand that these personal qualities are important elements in a flourishing human life, and that is what we want. Our Lady is critical to such a life. It was through her that the world received its light and it is through her that we continue to receive Jesus, who is the medicine of immortality.

As the summer progresses let us continue to pray the Holy Rosary. By means of the Rosary we progress further and further in love. In the Rosary we stay close to Jesus and Mary, as we meditate on their life. In response, Mother and Son welcome us into their bosom and invite us to claim the flourishing life for which Jesus suffered to bring us.
