

NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

On May 22, 2017, Joy Loboda, from Tampa, Florida, celebrated her second birthday. Normally, that is not big news. Not in this case. Almost six months earlier, Joy's heart stopped for nearly thirty minutes following an accident in a swimming pool. When Matt, her father, pulled his daughter's lifeless body out of the pool and began performing CPR, he saw her pupils shrink to the size of a pinpoint. He was convinced that she would die. Nevertheless, he and his wife. Kristin, prayed. They continued to pray after seeing the sorrowful look in the eyes of the EMTs, and they persevered in prayer when doctors said Joy's prognosis was not good, even though her heart had begun beating again. The Lobodas' story of their little girl fighting for her life spread like an epidemic and tens of thousands joined them in prayer. Joy's uncle, Fr. Ignatius Mazanowski, F.H.S, offered the Mass at her bedside several times.

Twenty-seven days after the accident Joy was carried out of Phoenix Children's Hospital in the arms of her mother, whose face was radiant with joy. The child was almost completely healed. She celebrated her second birthday with family and the medical professionals who saved her life. Lori Hadacek Chaplin interviewed Joy's parents, Matt and Kristen. Matt gets overcome by emotion, recalling the doctors telling him, "Joy has a slim chance that she is going to live; and if she does live, she's going to be a 'vegetable'." This past Memorial Day weekend, Joy swam with Matt, fearlessly, in the same pool that almost took her life. Her shrieks of laughter overshadowed the drowning flashbacks that flickered through Matt's mind. Kristin has not yet been able to bring herself to swim in the pool.

It has been a longer healing process for Kristin, who has been struggling to get past the trauma of seeing her daughter floating in the water. "I'll never forget the way my wife was wailing," Matt reveals. "My heart still breaks for her that she experienced that." Seeing Joy lifeless

was also overwhelming for Matt, but he focused more on his family. "I had to die to myself and care for my wife and children. I had to provide stability for them in the midst of a lot of instability," he explains.

Unlike Kristin, Matt did not feel consumed with guilt. Kristin says, "I am still healing from what happened. When I was in the hospital with her for the first day and a half, I felt like I had died with her." The Masses that Fr. Ignatius said at Joy's bedside were therapeutic for Kristin's soul. During the second Mass he stopped in the midst of his homily and said to his sister, "A lot of time we think that the healing of the heart can take months or years, but it actually can be quick. You need to forgive yourself." Kristen said, "When he said that, I broke into heart-wrenching cries. After that Mass, I was a new person; there was a supernatural strength that came over me." Even though Kristin has been able to forgive herself, she feels like she is living in a hyper state, and she grows very nervous whenever Joy is out of her sight, even for a moment. Kristin is seeing a Catholic trauma counselor. "She's been unbelievable in helping me wade through things."

The Lobodas' faith has gained strength from their trial. For Kristin, even though she was already a religious person, almost losing Joy has deepened her trust in God, and now she sees more vividly the beauty in suffering. "When I was in the hospital, there was so much suffering for Joy and me. The beauty is if you allow God to be present in your suffering, then you are able to feel Him in that suffering."
