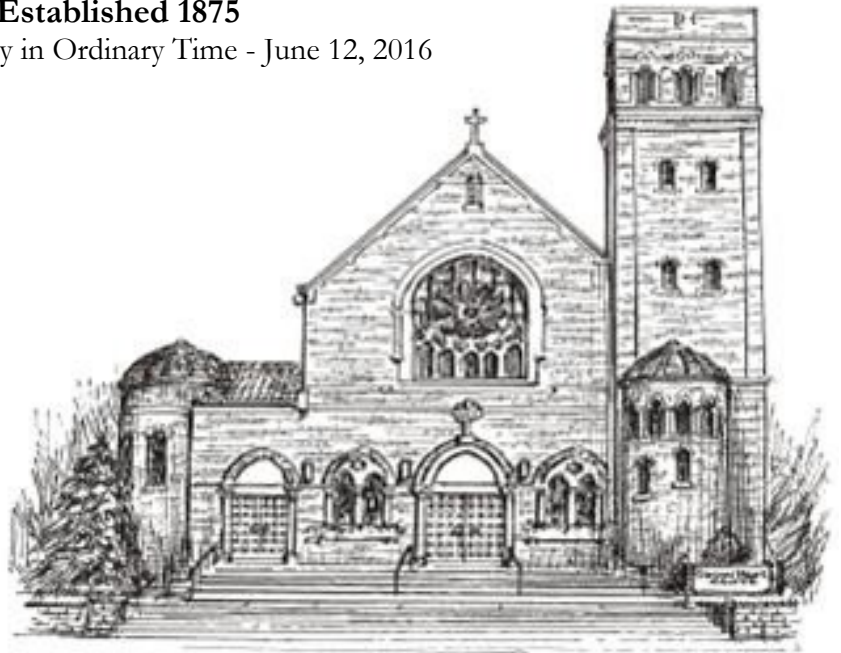

NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

Belinda Luscombe recently published an article entitled, “How to Stay Married.” (*Time*, June 13, 2016). She points out that studies suggest that married people enjoy many benefits. They have better health, and, statistically, will more likely die happier than single people. They are less likely to have strokes, heart disease or depression. They respond better to stress and heal more quickly. Karl Pillemer, who did an exhaustive survey of 700 elderly people, said, “Everybody—100%—said at one point that the long marriage was the best thing in their lives.” (*30 Lessons for Loving*, 2015). Couples in marriages in which the spouses are similar in background and values find it easier to stay married. In happy marriages the spouses tend to embrace one another’s interests. Religious people have a significantly lower divorce rate. That makes sense. When God is involved good things happen. Pillemer observed that long-married couples always acted as if divorce was not an option.

Divorce brings many struggles. A martial scholar that I know was charged in a study to find out five years after the separation if divorced spouses considered themselves happier than when they were married. This scholar told me over ninety percent of the couples that she interviewed said no. They thought the divorce would make their lives better, but, instead, the divorce only made their lives different. Now they have problems they never had when they were married. For instance, divorced women have the highest poverty rates among all ages of women in the United States. The biggest incentive to avoid divorce may be the children. The studies show that, in general, children from intact families do better on most fronts than those of divorced families. This is not to say that children of divorced parents are doomed to failure. We know many who do well. However, statistically, children of intact families are less likely to be poor, unhealthy, mentally ill, substance abusers or eventually divorced themselves. They are more likely to graduate college.

Luscombe emphasized that a major factor in the breakdown of marriage is contempt. By contempt, therapists mean making derogatory remarks about a spouse. It is communicated by constant interruption, dismissal of their concerns or withdrawal from conversation. Resentment and argument will soon

follow in such a relationship. One marriage therapist claimed that there are two main antidotes to contempt in marriage. First, figure out what specifically makes your spouse feel loved and act on that discovery. Second, learn to apologize properly. (Gary Chapman, *The 5 Love Languages*, 2005).

Another major factor for success in marriage was physical intimacy. A 2015 study from Canada found that couples who were physically intimate once a week had an optimum amount of marital happiness. Emotional intimacy and good communication are also recommended. Therapists point out that married couples should not allow their kids to keep them from going out. Even a simple walk for the couple alone after dinner can enhance a marriage. But this is not the time to work out differences. The fun and friendship mode of the marriage should not switch over to the problem and conflict mode. “Don’t mix modes,” said one scholar. Other simple ways to build up a marriage include family dinners and saying thank you.

For those who are thinking about marriage, the studies point to the importance of consulting people around you—family, friends, clergy—and asking them about the person that you are thinking to marry. I would add that the power of prayer cannot be overestimated. Marriage is a vocation, a calling from God. Therefore, He should be consulted as well, before *and during* the marriage. God bless you!

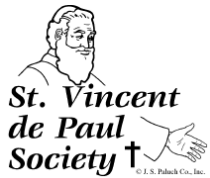
