NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

This past week (June 13th) we celebrated the feast day of a very popular saint: Anthony of Padua. St. Anthony was known for working miracles, which included a certain supernatural knowledge of the future. In Le Puy, France, there lived a notary, who led a very scandalous life. Nevertheless, every time Anthony met him he saluted him with a big bow, which was a sign of real reverence, and not merely a simple greeting. The notary, realizing that his unseemly lifestyle was known to the saint, began to think that Anthony was mocking him. The notary avoided the saint each time that he caught a glimpse of him from afar, changing direction so as not to meet with him. One day he crossed paths with St. Anthony unexpectedly, and there was the usual deference that he considered to be an affront. He shouted in anger, "If I did not fear God I would kill you right now! What have I done to you that you continue to make fun of me?" St. Anthony responded, "I make fun of you—of you who will accomplish great things for the Lord? You will be a martyr, my brother. Ah! If you only knew how much I begged from God this grace of being a martyr for Christ and yet I was not given it! But you will be. You will proclaim Christ openly before the tyrant. At the extreme point of that glorious ordeal remember me, I pray thee." The simplicity and the warmth with which Anthony uttered these words calmed the anger of the notary. He answered with a laugh at the prophecy. A short time later, he was invited to an expedition to Jerusalem with the Bishop of Le Puy. When he arrived in the Holy City the good Lord touched his heart and turned it so that he began to preach the divinity of Jesus Christ with great fervor. He was brought before the Muslim ruler, and,

after being tortured for three days, he died, thus fulfilling the prediction of St. Anthony.

Anthony knew very well that we do not know the hidden judgments of God. The person who appears now to be a great sinner may achieve everlasting glory in heaven. The person who appears to be holy can fall into sin and lose his share of paradise for all eternity. When Zaccheus, the tax collector, thought only of oppressing the poor, when Mary Magdalen filled Jerusalem with scandal, when Paul cursed and persecuted the Church, who would have imagined that they would ever have become saints? And on the other hand, who would have believed that Solomon, that fountain of divine wisdom, author of part of the Holy Bible, would die in the midst of debauchery and false idols? Who would have believed that Judas who lived with the Lord Jesus—the Light of the World—for years, day and night, witnessing His miracles and preaching, would betray his divine Master and give himself up to despair? These are examples that should make us tremble when we reflect upon the unsearchable mystery of the judgment and mercy of God.
