# NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

## Dear Parishioners,

In this month of the Sacred Heart we consider here the devotion from which our parish receives her name. Aristotle held that the heart is the first principle of movement in animals. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is the origin of God's love and our salvation. It was this Heart that was so moved with pity for our human wretchedness that He chose to become one of us, a man like us in all things but sin and ignorance, in order to bring His light to our darkness.

Four Saints in history had a particularly poignant experience of the Sacred Heart. Their mystical adventures have given the Church great instruction, illumination and inspiration.

St. Lutgardis of Aywières was born in the 12th century. She became a Benedictine nun and then began to receive visions of Jesus and His pierced heart. In one particular vision she experienced something that is known in mystical experience as an "exchange of hearts." Jesus asked her, "What, then, do you want?" She said, "I want Your Heart." In response, Jesus said, "You want My Heart? Well, I too want your heart." Lutgardis then declared, "Take it, dear Lord. But take it in such a way that the love of Your Heart may be so mingled and united with my own heart that I may possess my heart in You, and that it may always remain there secure in Your protection."

St. Mechtilde of Hackeborn was also a Benedictine nun. In the 13th century St. Mechtilde received many visions of Jesus during her life in the German monastery. A book was written about her experiences and Jesus appeared to her one day, holding this book on his Heart with his right hand. He kissed it, and said to her, "All that is found written in this book has flowed from My divine Heart and will return to it." Jesus also said to her, "In the morning let your first act be to greet my Heart and to offer me your own. Whoever breathes a sigh toward me, draws Me to him- or herself."

St. Gertrude the Great is yet another

Benedictine nun from the 13th century. She began receiving supernatural experiences at age 25. One day she saw both St. John the Evangelist and Jesus. She was invited to place her head on Jesus' heart and spoke to John, asking him, "Well-beloved of the Lord, did these harmonious beatings which rejoice my soul also rejoice yours when you reposed during the Last Supper on the bosom of the Savior?" John replied, "Yes, I heard them, and my soul was penetrated with their sweetness even to its very center." Gertrude asked, Why, then, have you spoken so little in thy Gospel of the loving secrets of the Heart of Jesus?" He responded, "My mission was to write of the Eternal Word ... but the language of the blissful pulsations of the Sacred Heart is reserved for latter times, that the time-worn world, grown cold in the love of God, may be warmed up by hearing of such mysteries."

Finally, there was St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. She was a French Visitation nun, who, in 1673, received visions of Jesus, in which He asked the Church to honor his Most Sacred Heart. Among the promises He uttered, Jesus said to St. Margaret Mary, "In the excess of the mercy of My heart, I promise you that My all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in My displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and My heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour."
