NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In high school during the sixties, Victor was a normal boy who enjoyed sports and dancing. He was quite popular among his fellow students. All of that changed drastically one day when he contracted Hansen's disease, also known as leprosy. His doctors assigned him to a leprosarium in Carville, Louisiana. He spent six lonely years there. Then the doctors discovered drugs that curtailed the effects of the disease. Fortunately, it was sufficient to save his life. Unfortunately, it was too late to prevent the disease from deforming his body. Victor now had one eye, a limp, and only partial use of his hands. His face was so disfigured that people would cringe at the sight of him.

Victor returned home in his early twenties. His old friends abandoned him, and not even his own parents could bear his infirmities. He became homeless. Victor would appear only at night so as to avoid the typical reaction of horror that he received whenever people saw him. It was no surprise that he slumped into a depression, convinced that nobody cared.

As his mental outlook grew darker the light of Grace appeared. Victor remembered a kind priest who had treated him with great compassion when he visited Victor and the other patients at the leprosarium. That priest was Bishop Fulton Sheen. Victor never forgot how Bishop Sheen treated him and the other outcasts with great dignity. Although he was not a Catholic, Victor decided to write to Sheen and ask for an appointment. He doubted that the letter would get through since Bishop Sheen was very famous and was receiving thousands of letters a month. To his great surprise, Sheen responded. He invited Victor to his office in New York. When Victor entered his office and sat down he blurted out bluntly, "I've come to you because I have no one to turn to. I haven't a friend in

the world." The bishop answered, "Well, you have one now."

Sheen began to act on that assurance almost immediately. He helped him find an apartment. He gave him food and clothing. He secured a job for Victor in a behind-the-scenes position where his deformities would not be a hindrance. Once a week, Victor was invited to Bishop Sheen's home for dinner. Because Victor had difficulty using his hands, Sheen personally cut his food for him during each meal. Eventually, with the Bishop's love and support, Victor regained his confidence. He began to once again show himself in public. When Fulton Sheen was installed Bishop of Rochester in 1966, Victor was sitting in the front row. Jesus once said: *What you do for the least of My brothers and sisters, you do for Me.* [Matthew 25:40]. At times, the least of His brothers and sisters appear in our path as very broken individuals. Sometimes the best we can do for them is what Fulton Sheen did for Victor: he affirmed his dignity. Each human person: male or female, black, white or brown, hetero- or homo-, rich or poor, born or unborn, has unfathomable human dignity. However, through no fault of God, what happens to us in this world can sometimes cause that dignity to be obscured. As a result, the darkness can overwhelm us, as it did to Victor. The (only) answer to the darkness is the light of Jesus Christ, that dwells within us. Our vocation as Christians—in Lent or out—is to let that light shine.
