NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

I wish you a very happy Lent. Thank you very much for your compassion and sympathy in the midst of my father's death last week. Thank you very much for coming to the wake and to the funeral Mass. Thank you also (very much) for your prayers.

With the passing of my father and the accompanying sorrow I recalled the words that the Blessed Mother said to St. Bernadette at one of her apparitions in Lourdes, France in February of 1858. By the way, my dad's birthday is February 11, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. She said, "I can't promise you happiness in this world, only in the next." Often in life, it seems that things are going well and we seem to have developed a nice rhythm in our relationships and in our activities and we find ourselves content. But then some trial, or tribulation or tragedy transpires and we are reminded that happiness in this world is like handling a slippery fish. It's there but it can easily elude our grasp, and often enough does.

What is the answer to this dilemma? St. Bernadette would say, I think, be grateful for life's positives and negatives. Be thankful for the bitter as well as for the better. Bernadette is our role model. She lived in great poverty as a child and then suffered many misunderstandings following her experience as a visionary of supernatural things. She also had tuberculosis, which ravaged her body over time in the convent. She once wrote a love letter to Jesus:

"Thank you for having filled with bitterness the far too tender heart You gave me! For Mother Josephine who said that I was good for nothing, thank you. For the mother mistress' sarcastic remarks, for rash

words, her ridicule, and the bread of humiliation, thank you! Thank you for making me the one to whom she could say: 'You are not like all the others.' Thank you for making me the privileged recipient of her rebukes, so that my sisters used to say, 'How lucky that we are not Bernadette.' Yes, thank you, Lady Mary, that I am Bernadette, who was threatened with prison because I saw you. I am she who the crowds stared at as a rare animal—that Bernadette so wretched that upon seeing her, it was said, 'Is that it?' For this pitiful body you have given me, this illness of fire and smoke, for my rotting flesh, my riddled bones, my sweats, my fever, my dull pains and my sharp ones, thank you my God. And for the soul that you have given me, for the desert of interior dryness, for your nights, for your lightning, for Your silences and Your thunder, for everything, for You absent and for You present, thank you Jesus

Thank you Jesus.

Lenten Regulations:

- 1. Lent is a special season of prayer, penance and Christian charity.
- 2. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as fasting, allowing only one full meal. A special dispensation for abstinence has been given for Friday, March 17th in honor of St. Patrick's Day.
- 3. The other Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat. The obligation of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday obliges all Catholics ages 21-59. The obligation of abstinence obliges all Catholics from age 14 onward. Those whose health would be impaired are excused from physical mortifications.
- 4. The Fridays outside of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat. Other acts of penance such as temperance, personal prayer, daily Mass and self denial may be substituted for abstinence.
