NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I recently read a beautiful meditation on what Jesus teaches us in the Eucharist. (*The End of the Present World and the Mysteries of the Future Life,* by Fr. Charles Arminjon [1887]). It is always enriching to consider the grandeur of the Eucharist, particularly in the month of May, when parishes all over are celebrating First Holy Communion.

Fr. Charles speaks of how Jesus instructs us in humility in the Blessed Sacrament. "Wholly present in each Host, He becomes, as it were, a speck of dust in order to confound our vanity and our ambitions and the thirst that men have to put themselves forward. He does not reserve to Himself any means of protecting His dignity, I don't mean against our profanations, but against our forgetfulness, our negligence, and our surprises."

Jesus also teaches us patience. As Fr. Charles explains, "He endures abandonment, loneliness, and disdain. He does not complain of our coldness and indifference. He keeps silent, never betraying His indignation . . ."

Jesus shows us the way of charity in the Holy Sacrament of the Altar. "He begs, intercedes, and bends; He restrains the wrath of His Father by showing Him the scars of His wounds; and to appease Him, He offers up the sacrifice that commemorates the death He underwent for us."

The good Lord also teaches us holy poverty. Not all poverty is holy. He "gives us admirable examples of the detachment that we should have in our dealings with creatures. In His Eucharistic life Jesus Christ does not hold onto any created object. Whether He is enshrined in a monstrance of precious stones, enclosed in a rich luminary, or placed in a wooden tabernacle or on bare boards, Jesus Christ offers no resistance, and never complains. He is indifferent of all our refinements and splendors: if He accepts our

adornments and the homage of our precious objects, it is out of graciousness, and for the sake of acquiescing in the outpourings of our piety. In this way He teaches us to despise all refinements and splendors; to remain indifferent to the goods of the earth, and to accept with the same equanimity the fame of honors or obscurity, abundance or scarcity."

Finally, Jesus instructs us in chastity. In the Eucharist, Jesus exists in a sacramental state, not under His own appearance. His appearance is so awesome in reality that if we saw Him as He really appears we would die of holy fear and awe and love. Therefore, He comes to us the Blessed Sacrament veiled under the presence of bread and wine. As such, says Fr. Charles, "His senses are incapable of receiving impressions. [At Mass] Our sweet odors do not flatter Him, our symphonies do not entrance Him, and our tangible objects do not enamor Him. He shows us thereby what purity should govern our affections. He wants us, like Himself, to be of flesh, without that flesh being subject to any rebellion; to open our eyes, but without bringing them to rest upon any creature merely out of pleasure and attraction; to breathe in sweet odors, but without ever feeling drawn to any but those of divine love."


