NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

I just finished reading Mystics & Miracles: True Stories of Lives Touched by God, by Bert Ghezzi. Dr. Ghezzi makes an interesting point that God touched many famous mystics after they prayed the traditional prayer: Veni Creator Spiritus, the ancient hymn to the Holy Spirit. The hymn is attributed to St. Rabanus Maurus, an abbot and archbishop who lived in ninth-century Germany.

The *Veni Creator Spiritus* marked the moment when St. Clare of Assisi (1194-1253) made her radical commitment to follow Jesus in poverty, chastity and obedience. St. Francis and his friars met the lovely runaway at the door of the Church of St. Mary of the Angels in Assisi. As they escorted her to the Altar, where she would embrace the Holy Gospel, they chanted this beautiful hymn to the Holy Spirit.

St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) characterized her early years in religious life as sludged in mediocrity. She says her spiritual life only began to flourish when her spiritual director required her to pray daily the *Veni Creator Spiritus*. Shortly after Teresa began to pray it, she experienced her first ecstasy. It was as if the hymn opened her spiritual ears to a divine voice within that motivated her to surrender deeply and completely to Christ.

The *Veni Creator Spiritus* also steepened the mysticism of St. Lutgarde (1182-1246). Biographer Thomas of Cantimpre reported that one Pentecost, when the hymn was chanted, observers saw Lutgarde mysteriously transported in prayer. They said she appeared to float off the floor. Thomas stated that the Saint's body seemed to share in the supernatural motions of her soul, which was elevated Heavenward.

The Holy Spirit is given to us so that we would transcend the limits of our own egoism. He loves us with a sincere, caring and committed love. He is our counselor, our advocate, our helper, and our teacher. He descends upon our hearts gently, like a dove.

Holiness is found by responding throughout the day to His subtle inner touches, which lead us to follow Jesus. Here is a version of the *Veni Creator Spiritus*:

"Come Creator Spirit, come from Your bright heavenly throne, come take possession of our souls, and make them all Your own. You who are called the Paraclete, best gift of God above, the living spring, the vital fire, sweet christening and true love. You who are sevenfold in Your grace, finger of God's right hand, His promise, teaching little ones to speak and understand. Oh guide our minds with Your blest light, with love our hearts inflame. And with Your strength, which never decays, confirm our mortal frame. Far from us drive our deadly foe. True peace unto us bring. And through all perils lead us safe beneath Your sacred wing. Through You may we the Father know, through You the eternal Son, and You the Spirit of them both, thrice-blessed Three in One. All glory to the Father be, with his coequal Son; the same to You, great Paraclete, while endless ages run."
