

A Note from The Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

In October 1995, Pope St. John Paul II visited the United States. On the last day of his trip, he was in Baltimore. It had been a very full day, beginning with a stadium Mass in the morning, a downtown parade, appearances at the cathedral, the basilica and a soup kitchen. He was to close the day with a quick stop at St. Mary's Seminary.

Because his schedule was so tight the plan was that he would simply greet the seminarians while they stood outside on the steps. But when he arrived at the seminary the Holy Father changed his mind. He decided to go into the building. The first thing he wanted to do was to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament.

When his wishes were made known, security flew into action. They swept the building paying close attention to the chapel where the Pope would be praying. For this purpose, highly trained dogs were used to detect any person who might be present. The dogs were trained to locate survivors in collapsed buildings after earthquakes and other disasters. These highly intelligent dogs went quickly through the halls, offices and classrooms. Then they were sent into the chapel.

They went up and down the aisle, past the pews and finally into the side chapel where the Blessed Sacrament was reserved. When they reached the Tabernacle the dogs sniffed, whined, pointed and refused to leave. Their attention was riveted upon the Tabernacle. Only their handlers could get them to go. They were convinced that they had discovered someone there.

The Most Holy Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ our Lord, blessed be His Name. Now Jesus is true God and true man. As man He is body, blood and soul. As God He is divine. So, in the Eucharist we receive Jesus Himself, all that He is: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. The Blessed Sacrament is not a what, it is a Who.

Blessed Siméon Cardon and five other Cistercian monks were beatified in Casamari Abbey in Frosinone, Italy on April 17, 2021. The ceremony took place in the very abbey where they were martyred more than 200 years ago. The Holy Father, Pope Francis, said, "In 1799,

when French soldiers, in retreat from Naples, sacked churches and monasteries, these meek disciples of Christ resisted with heroic courage, unto death, to defend the Eucharist from desecration." The Pope added, "May their example spur us to a greater commitment of fidelity to God, capable of transforming society and making it more just and fraternal."

The Holy Father reminded us that the Holy Eucharist is the focal point of the Church. "Eating together the Body of Christ: this is the core of Christian life," he said. "Being Christian is not first of all a doctrine or a moral ideal; it is a living relationship with Him, with the Risen Lord: we look at Him, we touch Him, we are nourished by Him and, transformed by His Love." What comes next? We look at, touch and nourish others as brothers and sisters, he said.

The Pontiff added, "... Jesus is not a ghost, but a living Person. When Jesus draws near to us, He fills us with joy, to the point of disbelief, and He leaves us bewildered, with that astonishment that only God's presence gives, because Jesus is a living Person." 
