ROM 8:8-17.

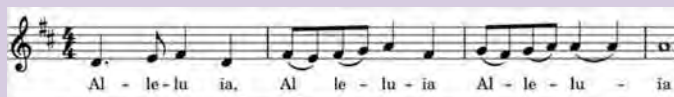

A Note from The Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Today is Pentecost Sunday. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Apostle tells us that one of the fruits of the Spirit is self-control. (Galatians 5:23). The Saints know plenty about this subject.

Early on Christmas morning 1886, when St. Therese of Lisieux was 12 going on 13, something special happened. Her family had a Christmas Eve custom in their French home. They would set out the children's shoes in front of the fireplace. When the family returned home from Midnight Mass, the shoes would be filled with Christmas gifts.

This particular Christmas, however, Therese's father forgot to put out the gifts. He is St. Louis Martin. Therese drew everyone's attention to the mishap. Then, she overheard her father complaining about Therese's advanced age for such a childish custom as the gift-shoes. He said to her sister, "Thank goodness it's the last time we shall have this kind of thing!"

Her father's words stung Therese to the core. She went upstairs in order to take off her hat. She had a lump in her throat. Her older sister Celine, sizing up the situation, told her, "Don't go downstairs again. Taking the presents out of your shoes will upset you too much." But that did not happen. At that moment, Therese received a profound grace from God to rise above her feelings for the sake of Christ. She descended the stairs with no trace of annoyance and filled with warmth, she proceeded to join her family.

In the Holy Gospel, the Lord Jesus Christ (blessed be His Name) once praised a poor widow for her self-denial. *He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling His disciples to Himself, He said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."* (Mark 12:41-44).

Some Saints were known for their singular acts of self-denial. Take St. Peter of Alcantara, a 16th century Franciscan priest in Spain. He always went barefoot. For 40 years he slept for only ninety minutes a day. When he permitted himself to sleep, he did so seated on a bench, with his head resting on a block of wood fixed on the wall. He would eat only every three days. His poverty was extreme.

St. Teresa of Avila said, "He was already very old when I met him for the first time. He was thin and his skin seemed more like the bark of a withered tree. He used to speak only when he was addressed. ... His conversation was amiable and pleasant."

Generally speaking, this kind of austerity is not for us. St. Peter of Alcantara and others like him received special callings from God for this level of penance. They were cleared for this severity by their superiors. I would not recommend it, certainly not. Even if we're not called to this behavior, each of us is nevertheless called to give deeply of ourselves, like the widow.

St. Therese is the model for an excellent kind of giving of self: to deny one's feelings for the sake of Christ. Therese was feeling as if she had every right to a good tantrum in response to the empty shoes of Christmas morning. However, she denied herself for the sake of being gracious. She denied herself for the sake of others. She denied herself for the sake of Christ through the presence of the Holy Spirit in her heart.

In her magnificent autobiography, she writes about the event. She said: "Therese was not the same girl. Jesus had changed her. I suppressed my tears, ran downstairs, and picked up my shoes. I pulled out my presents with an air of great cheerfulness. Daddy laughed and Celine thought she was dreaming ... I forgot myself and henceforth I was happy."

St. Augustine once said, "Conquer yourself and the world lies at your feet." More importantly, The Word of God says: *Christ died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for Him who for their sake died and was raised.* (2 Cor. 5:15).

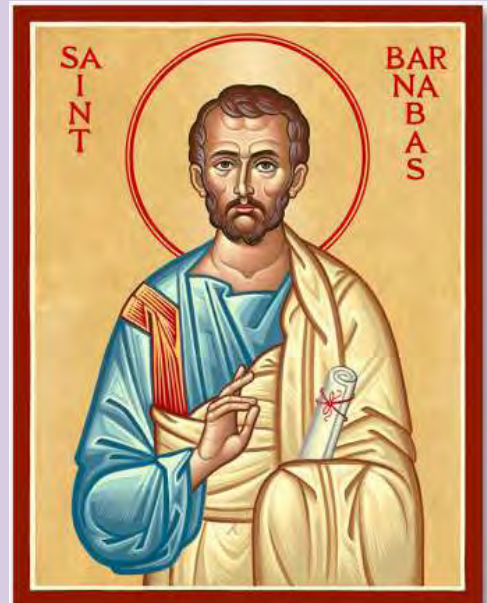
