## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

Vincent Capodanno was born in Mariners Harbor on February 13, 1929. He graduated from Curtis High School and attended Fordham University for a year. His hobby was swimming. In his early twenties, he heard the voice of Jesus within him calling him to the priesthood, and so entered the Maryknoll Missionary Seminary in Ossining, New York. He was ordained in 1957. Father Capodanno spent six years in the jungle in Taiwan as a missionary. Subsequently he went to Hong Kong to teach needy children.

When he was 35 years old, Capodanno volunteered to serve the Marines in the Vietnam War. After one tour of duty he was eligible to go home, but he requested twice to be reassigned because he very much wished to be where he believed he would be most helpful. He was deeply loved by his fellow Marines because he deeply loved them. Chaplains were discouraged from going out on the field with the soldiers but Father Capodanno insisted on doing just that. He lived like a Marine and he lived with the Marines.

On September 4, 1967, his regiment was severely attacked by North Vietnamese infantry. They were thoroughly outnumbered. He went from one wounded or dying soldier to another, anointing, comforting, praying. Then he heard the voice of a lone radioman: "We can't hold out much longer. We're being overrun." Fr. Capodanno ran toward him in a hail of bullets and helped him crawl to the top of a hill to relative safety. "I would never have made it up the hill alive without the chaplain's aid," said the soldier later. Then tear gas was dropped on the platoon and the priest gave his gas mask to a choking Marine who lacked one. When other Marines tried to give him theirs he said "You need it for fighting, I'm all right."

One corporal said that Fr. Capodanno was determined to do what he was there to do and to not let the enemy interfere. He said, "He would not get down because he wanted to look the wounded straight in the eyes. People were yelling at him 'Father, get down!' But Father Capodanno wanted to calm the wounded by looking them in the eyes." He continued to go back and forth giving last rites to the

dying and bringing in wounded Marines, one of whom said, "He made many trips, telling us 'stay cool, don't panic.'" Then he was wounded by shrapnel in the arms, hand and legs, losing part of his arm and fingers. The medic tried to patch him together but he waved him off. He said he wanted the wounded Marines to be taken care of first. Capodanno took 27 bullets on the battlefield. Even then, he threw himself on soldiers to protect them. He was gunned down ministering to a wounded medic he had crawled to with his left arm. It was fifty years ago last week.

When news got out about the death of the padre, Marines throughout the entire battalion openly wept for their fallen chaplain. One soldier near the battle said, "It was like playing chess and you lost your queen—morale-wise it was devastating." Capodanno died in Vietnam at only 38 years old. His body was recovered and buried in his family's plot at Saint Peter's Cemetery in our very own West Brighton. Father Capodanno was awarded the Bronze Star, the Silver Star, the Purple Heart and the Congressional Medal of Honor—the nation's highest military decoration. He never fired a shot.

Here was a man of great courage. He seems to have heard the words of Isaiah the Prophet and taken them to heart: *Thus says the Lord: say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! (35:4).* Why fear not? Because God comes with vindication. Fr. Capodanno knew this profoundly, and it enabled him to love even as the bullets flew. God comes with vindication for us too, and He is present in all of our earthly battles. St. Paul once asked: *What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through Him who loved us. (Romans 8:37).* Indeed, ultimate victory is assured to us through Jesus Christ, who promises to each of His faithful followers a heavenly medal of honor.
