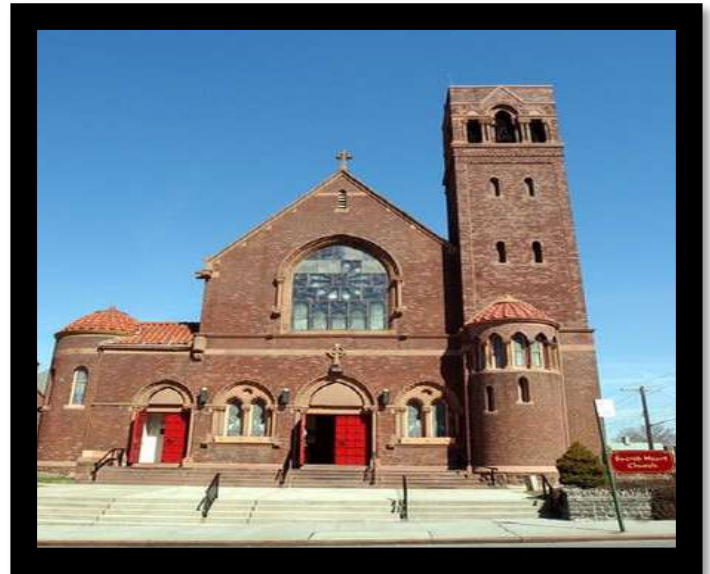

PHIL 3:8-14.

Brothers and sisters: I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having any righteousness of my own based on the law but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God, depending on faith to know him and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. It is not that I have already taken hold of it or have already attained perfect maturity, but I continue my pursuit in hope that I may possess it, since I have indeed been taken possession of by Christ Jesus. GOSPEL JN 8:1-11.

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. A Note from The Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Recently I was called to the hospital to give last rites to a suicide victim. Two hours later the patient was pronounced dead. It was a very heavy experience. I felt only a fraction of the pain that the family felt, please pray for them. After returning to the rectory and catching a couple of hours of sleep my day began. As the morning forwarded, I realized that I was broken-hearted. Since the sorrow wasn't going away, I decided to go over to our school and visit with the students at lunch and recess. Some told me about news in their class. Others declared that they were now big brothers and sisters. Some asked me to "take off" my finger—the old optical illusion trick in which one appears to be pulling off his digit. Others insisted on a group hug (please don't tell the Covid police). The innocence, and purity, and simplicity of these young ones, not to mention their unfeigned love, made the weight of the emergency room trauma feel much less. The light of God is in children!

Saints Jacinta and Francisco Marto are the only two children canonized who were not martyrs. Along with Lucia Dos Santos, who became a nun, they witnessed the miracles of Fatima in 1917. The Mother of God (where would we be without her) invited the children to do penance in reparation for sins and the conversion of poor sinners.

After the apparitions, they dedicated their lives to prayer and penance. Lucia lived until the age of ninety-seven, Jacinta and Francisco died in the Spanish Flu pandemic at the ages of nine and ten. Indeed, Sister Lucia, when writing about her two cousins many years later, said, "Jacinta took this matter of making sacrifices for the conversion of sinners so much to heart, that she never let a single opportunity escape her." Even on her deathbed, Jacinta refused to drink. Suffering from thirst, she wanted to offer penance right to her last moments.

There were two families in Moita, Portugal whose children would beg from door to door. As soon as she saw them, Jacinta said to Lucia and Francisco, "Let us give our lunch to those poor children, for the conversion of sinners." And she ran and did just that. That afternoon, she was hungry. There were oak trees nearby. Some of the acorns were ripe and some still green. The children opted for the unripe acorns and thereby make a sacrifice by eating the bitter kind. Even as children, they nevertheless lived lives of heroic virtue. The light of God was in them.

Maolsheachlann O Ceallaigh writes, "The desire for holiness was something urgent and immediate to them, not a vague aspiration. Seeing this in the lives of these children impresses on the rest of us, not only the reality of holiness, but the fact that holiness

is achievable—even little children like these could attain it. Can adults really claim that it is beyond their reach? The story of the lives of the Fatima children also emphasizes the fact that they understood ideas such as sin, holiness and penance, and that these are not complicated ideas."

"But there is a temptation to take an excessively sophisticated approach to Christianity, one which all too often means that our faith becomes whatever we want it to be—people who suffer from this tend to dismiss unquestioning piety as 'literal-minded' and 'simplistic.' Faith becomes a matter of seminars, retreats, lectures, insights, erudition. With this approach, we teeter towards gnosticism, the age-old heresy which takes innumerable forms, but which always promises enlightenment through some kind of advanced knowledge."

"Against this, how refreshing is the story of these shepherd children giving up their lunches and making innumerable other sacrifices, prostrating themselves in prayer so that their heads touched the ground (as an Angel had shown them to), and—in the case of Jacinta and Francisco—meeting their early deaths with such bravery! Please notice, as well, St. Jacinta's insistence on penance for the conversion of sinners. There was an evangelistic and soul-saving dimension to the children's sacrifices. They wanted not only to seek God, but to lead others to God—the Christian God."

"The idea has grown up in our modern society that sainthood is simply a matter of moral excellence, moral perfection. But Christian sainthood (and Christian life in general) must be concerned with the salvation of souls and the spread of the Gospel if it is to be Christian at all. This is a theme we will meet again and again in the lives of the Saints. Their charity was not simple philanthropy, but always had a supernatural aspect to it." (Maolsheachlann O Ceallaigh, *Inspiration from the Saints: Stories from the Lives of Catholic Holy Men and Women*, 2018, p. 19-20)

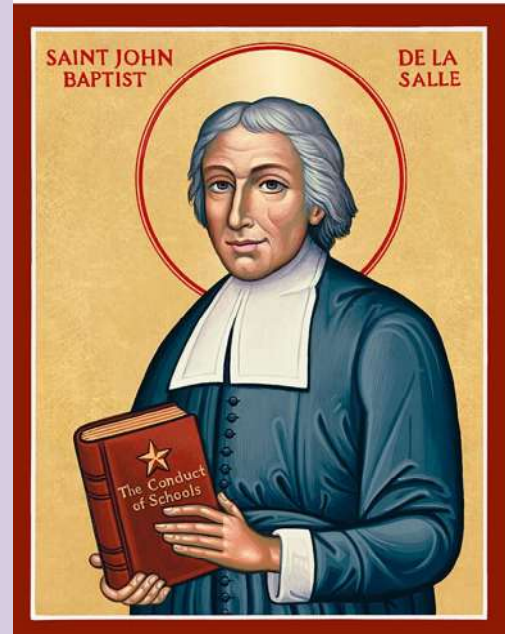

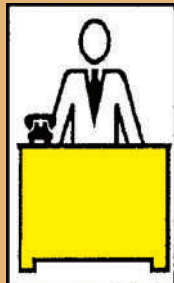
