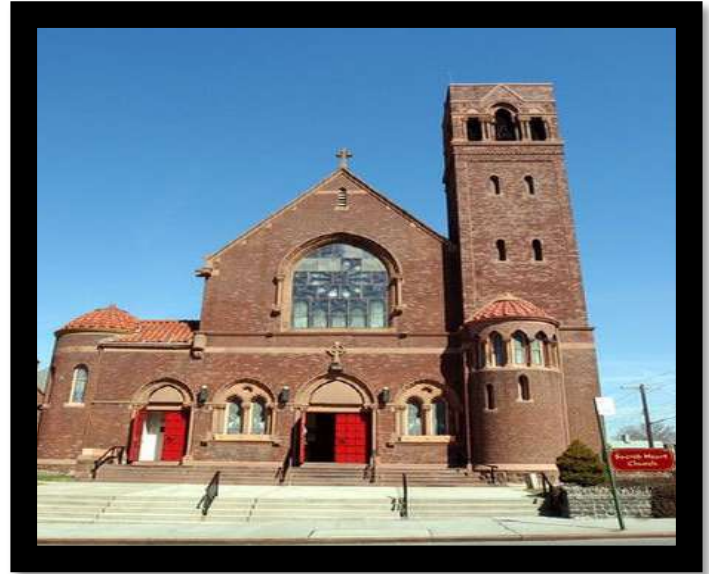

A Note from The Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Catholics love stories about conversion. We feel encouraged by the change of Saul, who traveled around arresting first century Catholics so that he could see to their execution. Then our Savior appears to him and blinds him with dazzling light, knocking Saul off his horse, and asks, “*Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?*” (Acts 9:4). In other words, by persecuting the Church, which is the people of God, you are persecuting the Lord Jesus Christ (blessed be His Name). Saul is converted and becomes St. Paul, the greatest missionary saint in history and the author of most of the epistles in the New Testament. Another convert is St. Mary Magdalene who was a woman of the night who became a woman of the light, the light of Christ, and was privileged to be the first biblical witness of the Resurrection.

Conversions happen all the time and throughout the centuries. There was a Frenchman named Charles de Foucauld. At fifteen he declared himself an atheist. Seven years later he failed out of school and then was expelled from the army because of his penchant for the party. He used to say of his overnight trysts, “I rent by the day, not by the month.” But then he returned to military service and experienced a conversion in the desert. After he died in 1916 his example of prayer and service inspired a community to form based upon his spirituality called the Little Brothers and the Little Sisters of Jesus. Charles said once, “The moment I realized God was real I knew that I could not do anything else but live for Him alone.” Charles is set to be canonized on May 15, 2022.

The Holy Season of Lent is upon us. Lent is the main penitential season of the Church. Therefore we will do penance. It would be a good thing if we did all of our penance now on earth instead of doing our penance in Purgatory, no? The word penance comes from a Latin word *poenae*. Don't think macaroni. *Poenae* means punishment. *Poenae* also forms the word penalty. Penance means punishing ourselves for our sins. Hence, Lent involves self-denial. In Psalm 17 it says: *Because of the words of your lips [O Lord] I have maintained hard ways* (Ps 17:4).

However, all of this is not our main task in Lent. Lent's self-denial in the form of prayer, fasting and good deeds are but instruments. A worker takes the trouble to obtain the instruments that he requires. However, there is no profit for him in merely possessing the instruments. What he wants with their help is to produce the objective, the goal for which these instruments are the means, such as a table or a cabinet. In the same way, fasting, vigils, scriptural meditation, rosaries do not constitute per-

fection but they are the means to perfection. Jesus is our perfection. Jesus is our sanctification. *He must increase I must decrease* (John 3:30).

Lent is about love: responding to the love of Christ, Who has so loved us and still loves us so immensely, so profoundly, each second of the day. Right now, Jesus is loving each of us with a burning, infinite love. If Lent is about love, that is why self-denial is central to Lent. After all, *love is not self-centered* (1 Corinthians 13:5).

We know what wonderful things that love can do. How many hard things have people endured in order to obtain what they loved? Look at what athletes do to win trophies and gold medals. Even when love is misdirected it can be quite powerful. Consider what ambitious people have suffered for the love of prestige and power. Look at what hedonists have suffered in their love for beautiful bodies. There are very many people in fitness centers everywhere who pay a high price to have nice figures primarily to “rent by the day.” Consider what misers have suffered for the love of money. Think of Henrietta Green who died in 1916, the same year as Charles de Foucauld. She had a net worth of \$95 million when she passed away, may she rest in peace. She was so cheap and mean that her son had to have his leg amputated because of the delays in finding a free medical clinic. She herself lived off cold oatmeal, which she refused to heat in order to reduce her energy bills, because of her distorted and enslaving love of money.

Man's first ruin was caused by love of self. If he had not loved himself above God, he wouldn't have turned away from God's will in the original sin so as to do his own will. “That, after all, is what loving oneself means: wanting to do one's own will” [St. Augustine, *Sermon 96*]. When we put God's will before all else, even our own will, we will love ourselves in the Christian way, and we will love the Lord, Who deserves all of our love and appreciation. By loving the Lord, we find ourselves loving all others as well, even our enemies.

Grant O Lord that by perfect self-denial and perfect mortification of our vices that we may arrive at perfect love of You this Lent. Amen.

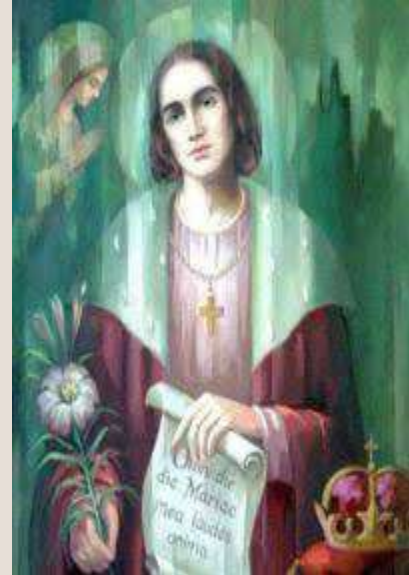
