




Jesus Christ is the firstborn of the dead; to him be glory and power, forever and ever.

GOSPEL

LK 20:27-38.

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her."

Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."



Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from Heaven (BOW) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into Heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Dear Friends of Sacred Heart,

Last Saturday, October 29th, at six-thirty in the evening, the parish hosted *“Remembering our Loved Ones: A Holy Mass for the faithful departed”*. It was well attended by many of those who lost a loved one. I intentionally did not want this be a “Bereavement Mass”. While it is true that grieving is part of the usual human experience every time we lose a loved one, I wanted to focus on “remembering” our beloved departed. In our Church calendar November 2nd is “All Souls Day”. This is a beautiful tradition as we pray and remember our ancestors who have gone ahead of us - on whose shoulders we stand and on whose legacy we live. Our “remembering” should focus not on our tears and not on our loss but on those times of joy and happiness. We remember their sacrifices and love which makes a difference in our lives now. It is in this kind of remembering that they become alive in us again. Our hearts turn from grieving to gratefulness to God for the blessing of their presence once in our lives. There is a beautiful prayer at the end of the Funeral Mass which says: Do you know that the Eucharist is a *“Celebration of Remembering”*? In Greek it is called “anamnesis” which means “a calling to mind”. The Eucharist is an “anamnesis” because we call to mind Jesus’ greatest example of sacrificial love – His dying on the Cross. Jesus, at the last supper before He died, said to His apostles *“do this in memory of me.”* One important benefit of the Mass we celebrate every day is our remembrance of Jesus’ greatest mission . The fulfillment of His Father’s will to redeem humanity through His sacrificial love on the cross. We celebrate and remember that salvific event at every Mass that we attend. What we celebrate in memory becomes alive and true in our lives as Christians making us more Christlike.

Part of the ceremony last Saturday was reciting the names of the deceased as a member of the family held a lit candle while standing on the sanctuary. The song “Go in peace” was sung so beautifully by Ava (she is known as the singing nurse for she sings to her ICU patients). She was accompanied by Tom on the piano and Arsenio on the violin. It was a beautiful moment of prayer and of endeavoring to let go of the sadness we feel for our departed loved ones. As the song goes *“Go in peace, there will be no more sadness, only joy and light, joy and light”*, it reminded everyone of what Christian faith professes about death. That death is not the end. Even though in the eyes of the world our beloved departed are dead, for us who have faith they are now at peace because they rest in the hands of God their Creator. Our beloved may have completed their earthly life but Jesus promised that He will save and raise them on the last day. This is what makes us Christians. This is the

spirit by which we remember, pray and honor our beloved dead. While mourning is part of losing, we always hope for the eternal life promised by the resurrection of Jesus. We thank Jesus for His death and resurrection which shows us the way for eternal life. His promise of the resurrection of the dead gives us hope that one day we shall be together again with our loved ones who have gone before us. If not for Jesus’ Paschal mystery, life would end in the utter destruction of death. Thanks to Jesus we shall see and be united once again with our loved ones because He has prevented death from destroying our eternal life.

As Catholics we remember by praying for the deceased especially when we offer memorial Masses for them. We also remember them by offering memorial candles and other traditional ways to remember and honor their lives. In this way we perpetuate their memories and they become alive in us. The whole month of November is a month of praying for All Souls. The beloved dead who have had Masses scheduled for them and those whose names are written on the envelope for All Souls will be prayed for everyday by our priests who celebrate Mass for the entire month of November.

Let us always remember our beloved faithful departed in our prayers and in our Masses for we are all united with them until that day when we shall see them with God face to face.

Assuring you as always of my thoughts and prayers. Please pray for me too. Take care of your selves and be healthy and happy! May God bless you and keep you.





CCD Registration 22-23: Registration for CCD Classes for the 2022-2023 school year has begun. To register your child for classes you can either drop off the forms to the Rectory or stop by The Rectory and fill them out. The Office Manager is in Monday—Friday from 9AM—5PM. The cost is \$165 per child, \$400 for three children. Payment of the fee is not necessary to register your child and may be paid in increments. Only checks or cash no credit/debit cards. Any new or first time student must provide sacrament certificates. Classes are held every Wednesday, with grades 1-5 meeting from 3:30-5 PM and grades 6-8 from 5:30-7 PM.
