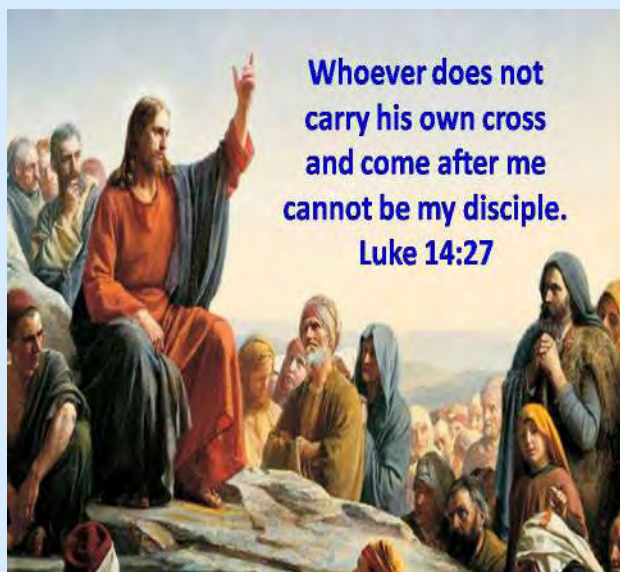


Let your face shine upon your servant; and teach me your laws.

A Note from The Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Father Antonio Sicari dedicates a chapter to Teresa of Calcutta (1910–1997) in his recent book: *How Saints Die: 100 Stories of Hope* (2021). He states, “She was born in Albania, entering when very young into a religious congregation that sent her to India, where she became the headmistress of a Catholic school. At the age of thirty-six, however, disturbed at the sight of a poor woman making her agonizing way along the street, her face gnawed away by rats and ants, she perceived ‘a call within the call’. So she decided to leave the convent in order to consecrate herself to the service ‘of the poorest of the poor’. She founded the Missionaries of Charity, set up to care for the dying, abandoned children, deformed babies, lepers, teen mothers, prostitutes, prisoners, homeless, alcoholics, the severely handicapped, the mentally ill, drug addicts, AIDS patients. In essence, all the ‘wounded of the street’ found in the homes of Mother Teresa a welcome and an open ear.”

“But it is significant to recall that Mother Teresa wanted some of her sisters to remain exclusively dedicated to the contemplation of Jesus-as-Eucharist. She always explained her work in the same way: ‘Everything we do—prayer, work, sacrifice—we do for Jesus. Our life does not have any other meaning, any motivation other than Him who loves us deeply. Jesus is the only meaning of our life.’ She was almost seventy years old when she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, and she used the opportunity to defend before that prestigious academy the rights of children not yet born. She still had eighteen years of apostolic labors ahead of her. Venerated by all, she felt like nothing more than a ‘poor pencil’ that God had wanted to use: ‘Very often I feel like a little pencil in God’s hands. He does the writing, He does the thinking, He does the movement, I have only to be the pencil.’ It seems that even during the last years of her life, God asked her—as He does with the greatest mystics—to bear the trial of interior darkness, allowing her to share in the sufferings of Christ on Calvary and even those of all non-believers. She accepted, saying humbly: ‘I have come to love the darkness, for I believe now that it is a part, a very, very small part the darkness and pain of Jesus on earth.’”

Mother Teresa had deep trust in Divine Providence. She believed that God was with her and therefore *fear is useless, what is needed is trust* (Luke 8:50). Father Leo Maasburg was a close associate of hers. He writes:

“One day Mother Teresa gave her last rupee to a priest, not knowing what she herself was going to

live on the next day. That evening a stranger knocked at her door and handed her an envelope with fifty rupees. Years later, when the Sisters were already feeding thousands of people in Calcutta, they suddenly ran short of food. They wanted to tell the poor people that there would be nothing for them that weekend, but Mother Teresa stopped them and withdrew to the chapel to pray. The next morning a truck brought large supplies of milk, bread and marmalade. What had happened? The government had closed the schools for some reason, and the food for the schoolchildren’s midday meal had been rerouted by some thoughtful person to the Missionaries of Charity.”

“Another time the flour ran out and there was no money to buy more. The Sister who was assigned to the kitchen went sadly to Mother Teresa, who gave her clear instructions: ‘You are responsible for the kitchen, no? Then go to the chapel and pray!’ While she was praying, a stranger rang the doorbell and delivered a huge sack of flour.”

“During their first years in Vienna, Austria the Missionaries of Charity were paying a relatively high rent for the premises they were using for the poor. When a close associate of hers told Mother Teresa his worries about this she just said, ‘God will take care of it!’ A short time later, she and the associate were about to drive off again when two elderly ladies stopped them. Mother Teresa had another appointment scheduled and so the associate wanted to tell the women that Mother could not see them. But while he waited, with the motor running, Mother Teresa spoke with them for quite a long time. Later, at the first red traffic light, she opened her patched handbag; in it was a bundle of about 300,000 Austrian schillings (then about \$ 15,000 [U.S.]). One of the ladies had given the money to her. Mother Teresa then turned to her associate and asked, ‘Do you understand now?’” (Fr. Leo Maasburg, *Mother Teresa of Calcutta, A Personal Portrait: 50 Inspiring Stories Never Before Told*, 2011.)

Six years ago today, Mother Teresa was canonized. In gratitude to God, and with trust in Divine Providence, we pray: St. Teresa of Calcutta ... pray for us!
